LETTER FROM GOMAGE TO C DATED 24 JANUARY 1958

As I told you before, I and the people in our organization insisted most emphatically to the King that he make a decision in regard to the setting up of a Bulgarian Representation Abroad before our Congress in New York since the decisions to be taken at the convention would depend on his answer. I now bring you the news that the King has decided to set up and announce a Representation before our convention. This was transmitted today by Stavev who had visited Volehev in Munich and both of them wrote to me. The King had accepted that which we had insisted on and had made a decision. Since various individuals and circles had conveyed to the King the idea that the Bulgarian National Front was trying to take over the BNA, the King, in order not to be accused that he had capitulated to the BNF, had asked Stavev to put other persons in the Representation in place of Volehev and myself. If this were done, the King would be ready to announce the Representation before our convention. I indicated my agreement and so did Volehev. The question is thus resolved and the Representation may be proclaimed in the beginning of February. The Representation will have the following composition:

a. Secretariat: Christo Stavev, Alexander Nikolaev (from Brazil) and Colonel M. (sic) Kostov (from Italy).

b. A council of approximately 15 persons which will include Dr. George Papprikov and Dr. Kalin Koychev from the BNF in America, Dr. Alexander Lyubenov from the BNF in Germany, Ivan Denchev from the BNF in Australia, and Dr. Atanas Kefsisov from the BNF in Spain.

The above Representation will be announced as a temporary one and an attempt will be made soonest to find a way of attracting other people and reconstructing the council. I will try to send you any new details when I receive them.
