




1. On 23 September, Rafael Otero was interviewed by the Washington Post (see attachment) in regard to the Letelier assassination. The article raised accusations of Otero's past associations with the Chilean National Intelligence Directorate (DINA) and the CIA which he denied. Our files reflect the following information regarding Otero:



b. In 1975, Otero was in contact with Cuban exiles in Miami.

c. Rafael Otero Echeverria, born in Santiago, Chile, on 9 March 1923, is a careerist in the media field and was assigned to the Chilean Embassy in Washington, D.C. on 28 January 1974, following Government service in Santiago as an elected member of the House (Camara de Diputados) in 1973. He has traveled extensively to the United States (1958-64-68-70), France, Italy, Germany, England and throughout all of Latin America. Otero's media career includes the following positions and associations: Radio playwright at Radio Sudamerica, Del Pacifico and Carrera (1942-44), Editor of the Chilean Rotary Club Review (1944-46), Commentator for the National Network Radio Station "Cooperativa Vitalicia" (1946-48), Secretary of







the Radio Workers Union (1947-48), Chief of the Program Department of the National Radio Network "Agricultura" (1948-49), Director and Under Secretary of the Journalist Union "Circulo de Periodistias" (1948-50), Journalist at "Rivista Ercilla" (1949-61), Professor of Journalism at the University of Chile (1956-58), Columnist and Commentator at "El Debate" and "Mundo Libre" newspapers (1961-63), Chief Editor of Radio Balmaceda (1963-66) and "Radio Mineria" (1967-68), owner and Editor of the News and Radio Program Service "Servicios Periodisticos Asociados - SEPA" (1969-74), and Chief editor of SEPA's Political and Economic Weekly (1970-73). Otero was an elected member of the Santiago Capital municipality and, in 1973, was elected to the Chilean House of Representatives.

## Bomb Victim, Threatened For Attacking Chile Junta

Rafael Otero, counselor for public affairs at the Chilean Emoassy, said in an interview yesterday that no one from the embassy had been questioned by either the FBI or the District police about the bombing.

Otero said that the Chilean ambaisador to the United States, Manuel Trucco, had contacted the State Department to offer "full cooperation" in the investigation. "We're very interested in going on with this investigation because this is the worst thing that could happen to my country at this moment," Otero said.

Ofero suggested that Leteller's murder, and those of other Chilean exiles in other countries that preceded it, have come in the fall and were timed to coincide with the opening of the United Nations General Assembly sea-

"We are asking to help. It's the first opportunity to find out who is making this attack against the Chilean people," Otero said.

When a sixed about reports ... of threats made here and reportedly in Chile against Letelier, Otero referred to the lifting of Letelier's Chilean cittaenship on Sept. 10 by the current government. Otero said that the "Chilean government doesn't need other means" beyond revoking a person't citteenship.

Otero, a short, stout man, was calm during much of the interview until informed that he was being widely described by Chilean exiles and leftists and washington as being the representative of the National Directorate of Intelligence (DINA), the most important secret police agency in Chile. > Rearing this, Otero responded with leughter and taid that this report was "very frang." Otero denied having any role in DINA. The reports, he said, were a way "for the extreme left to point the finger" at him, and he said he would report the information to the U.S. State Department today since he took it as a threat against him.

Otero also raised and denied reports that he was affiliated with the
CIA in Chile. Describing himself as a
journalist. Otero said he had published SEPA, on anti-Allende magazine, and that he had been imprisoned
28 times "during Allende."

Otero raised the question as to why
the explosion of Leteller's car occurred within 100 feet of the Chilean ambassador's residence 'at 2305 Massachusetts Ave. NV.

At several points during the interview. Otero repeated his assertion that the Chilean government had not had anything to do with Leteliers murder. We know we don't have anything to do with this murder." Otero said. "We know... It's the worst thing that can happen."
