1. [Interview with Bishop Roberto Joaquin Ramos by reporter at radio station--live]

- 2. [Text] [Reporter] Welcome, Mr Bishop.
- 3. [Ramos] Thank you. I want to appeal to the Salvadoran people for peace so that we may all struggle to build a community where [words indistinct] values.
- 4. It is regrettable that the dialogue process has come to a halt and that at a moment when the Germans are celebrating their unity, we are initiating an armed struggle.
- 5. I especially want to express my regret at the assassination of the Jesuit priests. This was a savage crime without precedent in El Salvador's history. [Words indistinct] to worsen the country's situation and to exacerbate passions to make peace increasingly difficult.
- 6. I hope that my brothers, all the Salvadorans who believe in Christ, may learn to value life as a precious gift from God, may learn to respect life, to respect other people's opinions, and to love others in spite of differences.
- 7. I also hope that this painful situation we have endured for the past 10 years will make us more aware of our duties as citizens and Christians. We have the obligation to build a more just society, more deserving of the name the nation has carried since the days of the colony: El Salvador.
- 8. I want the Savior to [words indistinct] to calm down this thirst of blood that is [words indistinct] and destroying useful lives, the

- 9. [Reporter] Your statement comforts us at this difficult moment. Do you have any recommendation for the Salvadoran people as to what to do at this time?
- 10. [Ramos] I recommend to the Salvadoran people to remain calm, and especially to pray. [Words indistinct] the hearts of peace through love for God and the faith we may have.
- 11. [Reporter] Do you have any recommendation for the rebels, for the FMLN specifically?
- 12. [Ramos] I would ask them to reestablish the dialogue that has been broken. It has been confirmed, since the days when Cain killed his brother Abel, that violence is not the solution to injustice. Violence generates more violence, and, as civilized people, we should resolve our differences through negotiations and dialogue.
