EL SALVADOR: FDR'S UNGO REACTS TO INES DUARTE'S RELEASE

((TEXT)) SAN JOSE, 24 OCT (AFP) -- GUILLERMO UNGO, TOP
LEADER OF THE OPPOSITION REVOLUTIONARY DEMOCRATIC FRONT (FDR),
VOICED HIS SATISFACTION OVER THE RESOLUTION OF THE KIDNAPPING OF
INES GUADALUPE DUARTE, OLDEST DAUGHTER OF SALVADORAN PRESIDENT
JOSE NAPOLEON DUARTE.

INES GUADALUPE WAS RELEASED TODAY AFTER BEING HELD HOSTAGE FOR
44 DAYS, IN EXCHANGE FOR THE RELEASE OF 22 POLITICAL PRISONERS
AND THE DEPARTURE FROM THE COUNTRY OF 90 MAILED REBELS.

"THAT DEMONSTRATES THAT AN UNDERSTANDING THROUGH DIALOGUE AND
NEGOTIATION IS POSSIBLE EVEN IN THE MOST DIFFICULT
SITUATIONS," UNGO SAID, STRESSING THE PARTICIPATION OF THE CHURCH
AND GOVERNMENTS OF THE FRG, FRANCE, AND MEXICO IN THE
NEGOTIATIONS.

HOWEVER, UNGO EXPLAINED THAT THE FOR "HAD NO INVOLVEMENT
IN THE NEGOTIATIONS" BECAUSE "IT HAD NO PARTICIPATION IN THE
KIDNAPPING."

THE SALVADORAN OPPOSITION LEADER, WHO IS PARTICIPATING IN A
SEMINAR ON NEW FORMS OF COOPERATION BETWEEN EUROPE AND CENTRAL
AMERICA HERE, ADDED THAT "ONE CANNOT IGNORE THAT DUARTE'S DAUGHTER
IS A PERSON WHO IS NOT INVOLVED DIRECTLY IN THE WAR STRATEGY."

"HOWEVER," HE INDICATED, "COUNTERINSURGENCY IMPLIES A DIRTY
WAR ON THE PART OF THE GOVERNMENT WHICH LEAVES THOUSANDS OF DEAD
AND MISSING, INCLUDING MANY RELATIVES, WOMEN, AND CHILDREN SUSPECTED
OF BELONGING TO OR COLLABORATING WITH THE FDR AND THE FMLN."

"THE FMLN," HE SAID, "DOES NOT HAVE THAT ATTITUDE."

THE KIDNAPPING AND RELEASE OF INES DUARTE, IN UNGO'S OPINION,
MAY HAVE AMBIVALENT RESULTS, POSITIVE OR NEGATIVE, BUT ABOVE ALL
"IT STRESSES AGAIN THE NEED FOR DIALOGUE AND NEGOTIATION."

IN EL SALVADOR, UNGO NOTED, THE IMPORTANT THING "IS DIALOGUE,
WHICH SHOULD INCLUDE, AMONG OTHER THINGS, THE TREATMENT OF CIVILIANS
AND RESPECT OF THE RELATIVES OF COMBATANTS ON BOTH SIDES."

MAINTAINING CAUTION REGARDING THE RECENT OUTCOME OF THE
SITUATION, HE LIMITED HIMSELF TO SAYING THAT THIS INCIDENT "MAY
SERVE TO REINITIATE THE DIALOGUE OR TO HARDEN POSITIONS."

ON THE REPERCUSSIONS THAT THE KIDNAPPING MIGHT HAVE ON THE
SALVADORAN GOVERNMENT, UNGO INDICATED THAT "DUARTE CAN EMERGE
STRENGTHENED OR WEAKENED, IT ALL DEPENDS ON HOW HE FACES THE FUTURE,"
ADDING THAT "IT IS CLEAR THAT THE RIGHT IS NOT GOING TO
