








Iraqis Seek Asylua in Turkey

Over 2,000 Iraqis have fled to Turkey since the outbreak of hostilities, according to a Turkish press source.


Rany of the defectors are Iraqi soldiers.

Commant: The number of soldiers and their families fleeing to Turkey has increased over the last week primarily from units in Iraq. Some deserters are heading to Turkey to avoid capture and likely execution for going AVOL.

Arab Maghreb Union: Foreign Ministers Meet in Banghasi

Libya has called for an emergency meeting of the five Arab Maghreb Union Foreign Ministers today in Banghazi to discuss the war in the Persian Gulf and other issues, according to press reports. The Union is made up of Libya, Tunisia, Algeria, Morocco, and Mauritania.

Comment: Tripoli probably will push for a joint statement supporting the Soviet peace plan. Qadhafi almost certainly believes his newly acquired position as chairman of the AMU Presidential Council will give his efforts to resolve the Gulf war increased visibility, credibility, and legitimacy.

China Stands Firm with Iraqi Envoy

China's Premier Li Peng told visiting Iraqi Deputy Prime Minister Hammadi today that Beijing opposes Iraq's occupation and annexation of Euwait and demands its unconditional withdrawal, according to Chinese press reports. The visit was put together on vary short notice, according to US diplomats, but Hammadi nonetheless was able to meet for over an hour with Li, Foreign Minister Qian Qichen, and Vice Foreign Minister Qi Hauyuan; he also had a working lunch with Vice Premier Mu Xueqian.

Comment: By accepting the hurried visit and repeating its standard position on Iraqi withdrawal, Beijing is cultivating an international image of peace-oriented goodwill and activism, while apparently resisting Iraqi efforts to elicit Chinese support for its peace plan. Probably to avoid any appearance of tilting toward Beghded during this high-profile visit, Li's reported remarks avoided China's recent emphasis on the need for
