MILITARY OFFICERS INVOLVED IN THE PEACE NEGOTIATIONS WERE BEGINNING TO FORM THE OPINION THAT PRESIDENT SERRANO WANTS TO ACHIEVE A PEACE ACCORD SO MUCH THAT HE IS WILLING TO AGREE TO ANYTHING. THE MILITARY WOULD NEVER ACCEPT A DECISION ON ITS FUTURE, INCLUDING FORCE REDUCTION ISSUES, THAT ARE DICTATED BY THE URNG.

THE DECISION ON THE MILITARY'S FUTURE ROLE IN GUATEMALA, INCLUDING ANY FORCE REDUCTIONS, SHOULD BE DECIDED BY CIVILIAN AND MILITARY OFFICIALS WITHIN GUATEMALA--PERHAPS EVEN WITH THE PARTICIPATION OF THE PRIVATE SECTOR--BUT DEFINITELY NOT BY THE URNG. MILITARY OFFICERS DO NOT TRUST PRESIDENT SERRANO'S JUDGMENT IN THE NEGOTIATION PROCESS.

A RECENTLY PUBLICIZED DEATH THREAT LIST, WHICH CONTAINED THE NAMES OF VARIOUS JOURNALISTS AND LABOR LEADERS.

THE LIST ORIGINATED IN ARCHIVOS, ALTHOUGH THE PUBLIC PLACED THE BLAME ON THE D-2. CITED THE MYRNA MACK MURDER AS ONE OF THE MORE VIOLENT AND POLITICALLY COSTLY ACTIONS UNDERTAKEN BY ARCHIVOS FOR WHICH THE D-2 WAS BLAMED.
