POLAND

An unusually high level of Warsan Pact military activity is taking shape in and around Poland, impolving Soviet, East German, Polish, and possibly Czech forces.

reports suggest that these forces are collaborating in an air and air defense exercise. There has been no public announcement of such an exercise by Warsaw Pact authorities. The exercise probably will be directed by the Soviet General Staff

The activity observed over the past several days is unprecedented for this time of year. The developments could involve further preparations leading to military intervention in Poland or, at a minimum, serve as an intimidating signal to the Polish population.


Recent Developments


- --The chief of Soviet forces in East Germany has imposed travel restrictions from 29 November to 9 December covering the largest overall areas ever closed to US, UK, and French military observers. The restricted areas encompass a large part of East Germany along the border with Poland. US defense attaches in Moscow recently had a visit canceled to areas along the Polish-USSR border for "reasons of a temporary nature."

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air defense personnel were informed last Thursday that leaves were to be restricted pending a "big action."




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Top Secret

Soviet Commentary

Soviet commentaries published over the weekend confirm that Moscow intends to maintain a higher level of political pressure on the Poles to put their house in order. The commentaries blast Polish dissidents, the *West, and the Chinese for working against "a normalization of the situation." One commentary also makes ominous allusions to the Czechoslovak crisis in 1968.

Central Committee Meeting

Party leader Kania hopes to use the Central Committee meeting, which convenes today, to rally support for his leadership and to give the party a new sense of purpose.

Kania's prospects for success are at best questionable. The party's newspaper admitted on Saturday that many members expect to return to their "former style of work." The party at all levels is demoralized by its inability to control events and by the lack of direction from the top.

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
