Human Rights Developments

Some 200 Peruvian workers are being detained in connection with a general strike on 27-28 February. Most of those arrested participated in civil disturbances in the Lima-Callao area, but arrests of leaders of the Communist General Confederation of Workers, which sponsored the strike, also have been reported.

The strike was called to protest the dismissal, arrest, and deportation of union activists who participated in a more serious walkout last July that paralyzed the capital and precipitated rioting that left six dead. This week's strike, which was intended to force the government to grant a labor amnesty, appears to have been a failure.

The Peruvian Government is split over the best way to handle the labor agitation. President Morales Bermudez is said to favor the amnesty, but hardliners in the military believe that giving in to the leftists' demands could trigger further worker protests over high prices and fuel demands for higher wages.

The government feels it must hold the line, for strict adherence to its tough austerity program is essential if Peru is to qualify for the foreign loans necessary to guarantee the success of its economic stabilization program.

On 26 February, the day before independence day in the Dominican Republic, President Balaguer made several human rights gestures. Thirty-eight prisoners were pardoned, re-entry prohibitions were lifted against 66, and passports were ordered returned to 55 Dominicans.

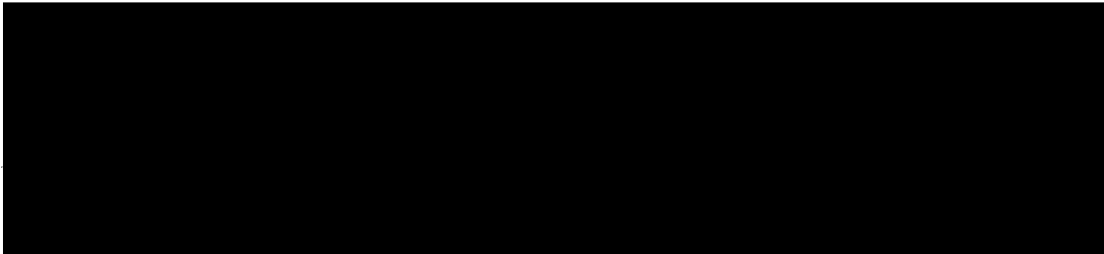
