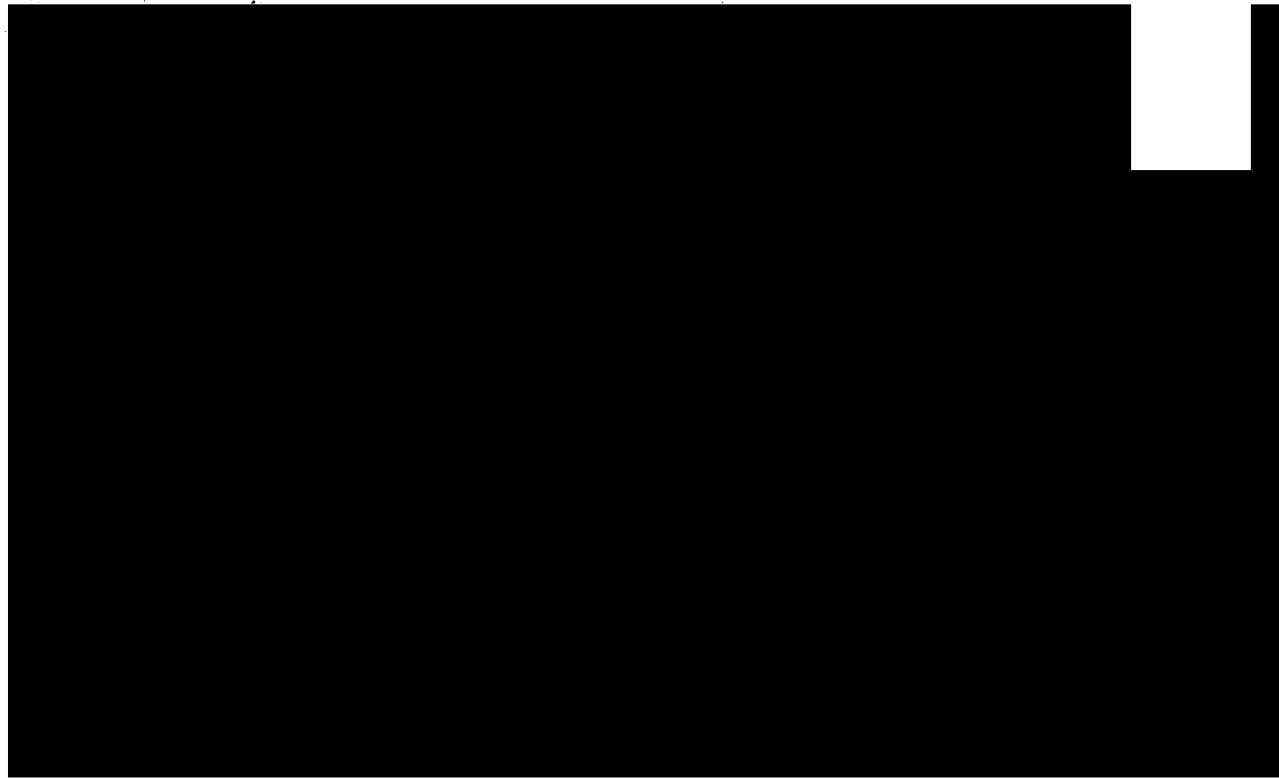

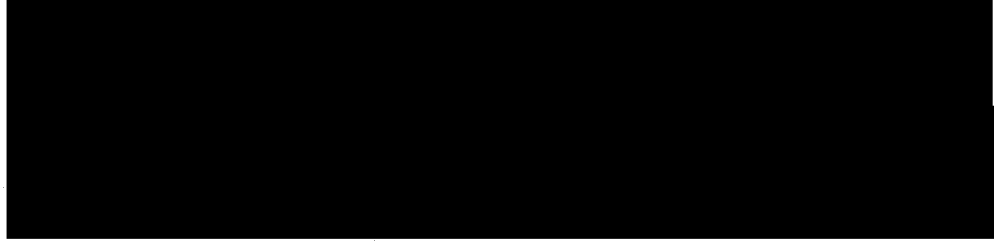

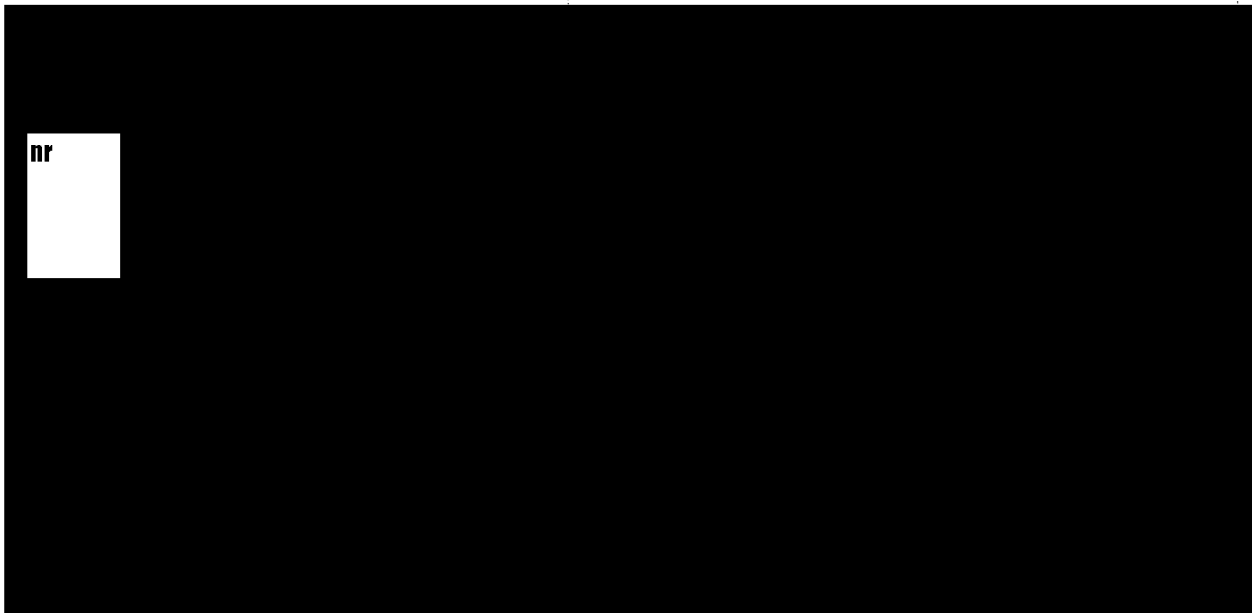

Chile will continue to work with a United Nations human rights investigating group. If the group agrees to the government's ground rules for its work in Chile, it may be allowed to visit Santiago. Meanwhile, the Chilean Supreme Court has upheld a lower court's refusal to act on behalf of three women denied reentry to Chile in November. *The women had sought international assistance to force the Chilean government to release information on the fate of missing persons in the country. The three women reportedly plan to make another attempt to return to Chile in the near future.*

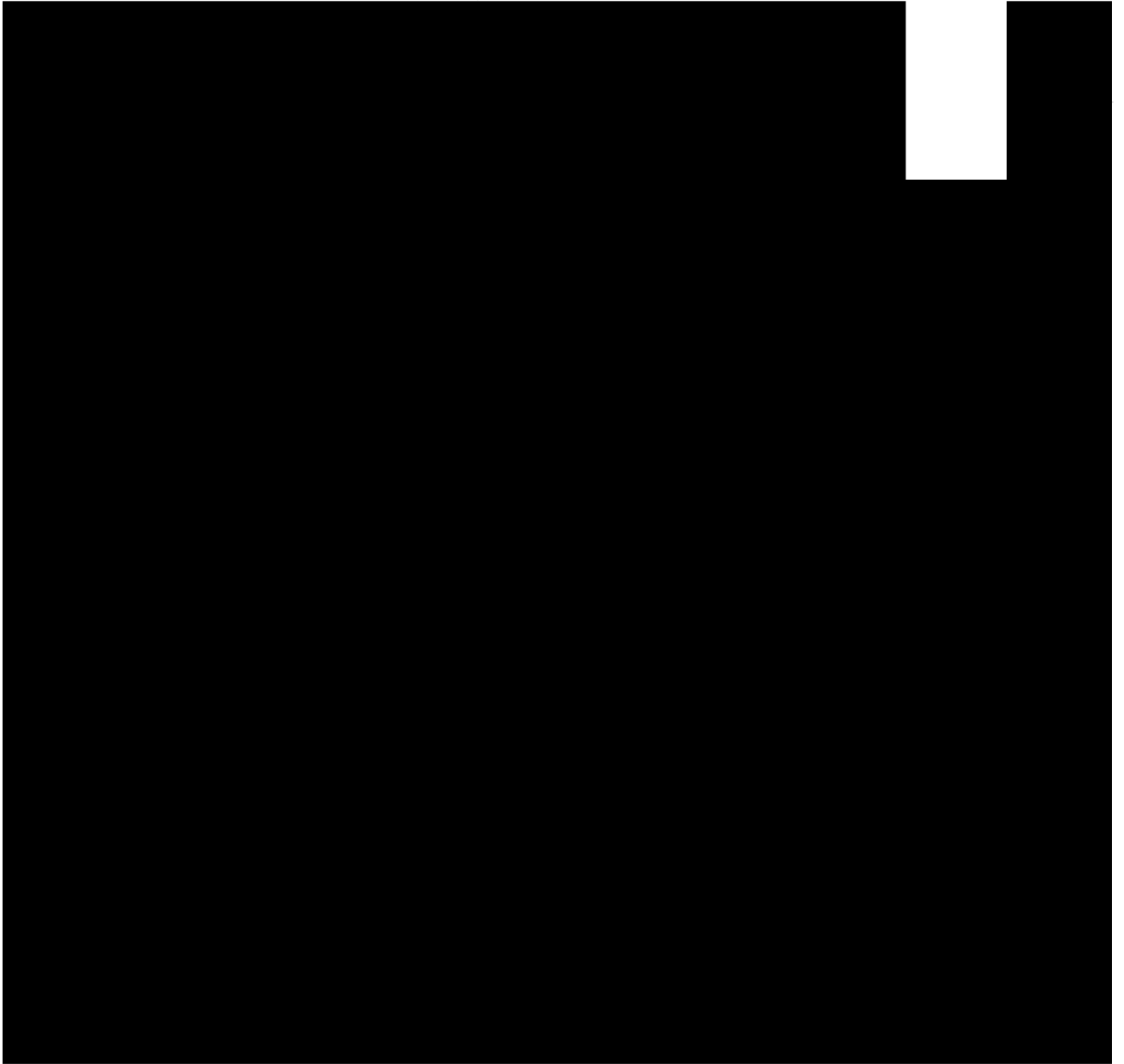
