-- Chilean President Pinochet reportedly is so incensed over US co-sponsorship of a UN resolution condemning Chile for human rights violations that he has asked the Foreign Ministry to assess the consequences of a Chilean withdrawal from the UN and its affiliated international organizations. *The fact that Cuba was among the nations that joined the US in co-sponsoring the resolution caused particular consternation in Santiago. Foreign Ministry officials believe that it would be a serious mistake for Chile to withdraw from the UN, however, and they are trying to calm the President. The government, meanwhile, has not implemented plans [redacted] made earlier this year to lift the state of siege on December 11.*

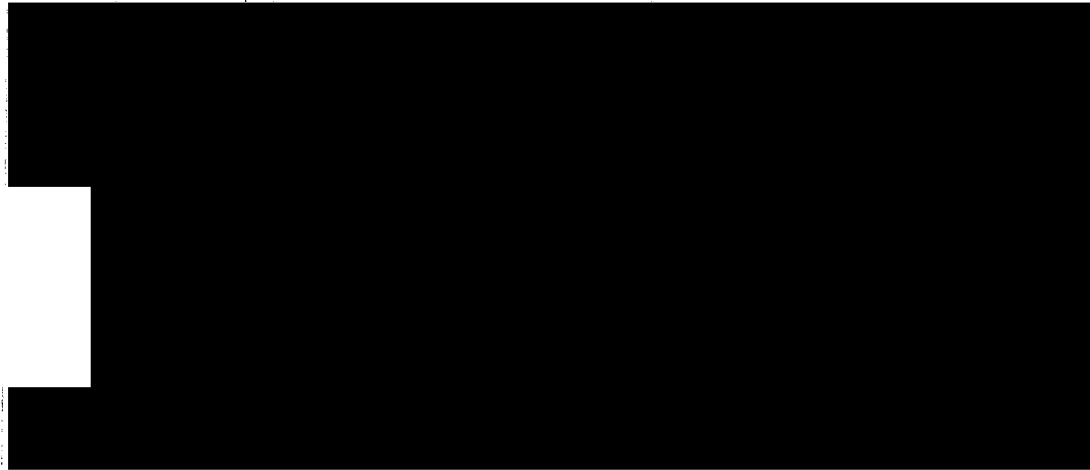
