1. [REDACTED] MAY, THE DIRECTORATE OF NATIONAL INTELLIGENCE (DINA) ISSUED A WRITTEN INSTRUCTION TO ALL DINA PERSONNEL, ADVISING THEM THAT THE MISTREATMENT OF DETAINEES WOULD BE PUNISHED BY DISMISSAL FROM THE SERVICE. THE INSTRUCTION STRICTLY FORBIDS [REDACTED] [REDACTED] THE DETENTION OF PERSONS WHO DO NOT REPRESENT A REAL THREAT AND POSSESS INFORMATION OF [REDACTED]

IMPORTANCE, IT ORDERS THAT BREAK-INS AND DETENTIONS BE AVOIDED TO THE MAXIMUM POSSIBLE; HOWEVER, IF SUCH MEASURES ARE [REDACTED], THEY WILL ONLY BE CONDUCTED UNDER THE WRITTEN ORDER OF THE DIRECTOR OF DINA OR, IN HIS ABSENCE, ONE OF THE THREE DEPUTY DIRECTORS OF DINA.

2. IN A FOLLOW-UP INSTRUCTION [REDACTED] JUNE, THE DIRECTOR OF DINA LIMITED THE POWER OF DETENTION TO ONLY 80 DINA OFFICERS, WHO ARE MEMBERS OF THE NATIONAL INTELLIGENCE BRIGADE (BIN) OF DINA. THIS INSTRUCTION AGAIN SPECIFIED THAT DETENTIONS COULD ONLY BE MADE UNDER THE EXPRESSED ORDER OF THE DIRECTOR OF DINA. THE INSTRUCTION FURTHER STATES THAT DETENTIONS IN THE PROVINCES WILL BE MADE BY THE LOCAL AUTHORITIES, BASED ON INTELLIGENCE GATHERED BY DINA; HOWEVER, THE DETAINEES SHOULD BE TURNED OVER TO DINA FOR PROCESSING.

3. [REDACTED] COMMENT: SANTIAGO EMBASSY TELEGRAM 4895 OF 15 JULY REPORTED THAT PRESIDENT AUGUSTO P I N O C H E T HAS BEEN MEETING WITH APPROPRIATE AUTHORITIES TO EMPHASIZE THE IMPORTANCE OF AVOIDING ALL HUMAN RIGHTS ABUSES.

[REDACTED], IN [REDACTED] JULY MEETING WITH [REDACTED], PRESIDENT PINOCHET WARNED THAT INCIDENTS OF "EXCEEDING AUTHORITY" IN THE AREA OF HUMAN RIGHTS WOULD RESULT IN SEVERE DISCIPLINARY ACTION. THE PRESIDENT LATER ADDRESSED [REDACTED] WITH A SIMILAR MESSAGE.)

4. [REDACTED] MAINTAIN THAT SINCE THE GOVERNMENT RULING IN MAY WITH REGARD TO THE TREATMENT OF DETAINEES, DINA HAS REPORTED ALL DETENTIONS TO THE MINISTRY OF INTERIOR WITHIN 24 HOURS. THEY POINTED OUT, HOWEVER, THAT THEY DID NOT KNOW HOW LONG IT TOOK THE MINISTRY OFFICIALS TO INFORM THE DETAINEE'S FAMILY.

5. [REDACTED] STATE THAT BETWEEN 1 JANUARY AND 15 JULY 1975, THE ORGANIZATION HAS DETAINED 672 PERSONS. OF THAT TOTAL, 353 HAVE BEEN RELEASED, 115 HAVE BEEN EXPELLED FROM THE COUNTRY, AND 130 ARE IN DETENTION CENTERS WAITING TO BE ACCEPTED AS REFUGEES. THE REMAINING 74 ARE HARD CORE LEFTISTS WHO HAVE BEEN TURNED OVER TO THE DETENTION CENTERS FOR INDEFINITE CONFINEMENT.

DETAINEES WERE BEING HELD AT THE DINA SECTION ("CUATRO ALAMOS") OF THE TRES ALAMOS DETENTION CENTER. OF THESE, FOUR ARE LEADERS OF THE MOVEMENT OF THE REVOLUTIONARY LEFT (MIR), [REDACTED] AND HAVE REQUESTED NOT TO BE RELEASED IN CHILE BECAUSE THEY HAVE BEEN CONDEMNED TO DEATH BY THE MIR. THE GOVERNMENT IS MAKING ARRANGEMENTS TO HAVE THEM SENT TO SPAIN.
