

OPERATION MASTER (Mister)

24 April, 1945

(See also account of Operation GALLAGHER by same operator, dated 3-4-45)

[REDACTED] employed by [REDACTED] at Ludwigshafen. On 21-3-45 he received a travel order from them to go to Nuremberg-Lengries-Salzburg-Nuernberg and back, to return by 22-4-45. Soon after he left Ludwigshafen, the city fell, but he continued to conduct business with the other branches of the company.

Note that the term of this mission has expired, he is collecting his salary from the paymaster. [REDACTED] in reality lives between Oberstdorf and Sondhausen, S of Kempten.

Having concluded business for the company in Salzburg, he got a ride to Feldkirch, where the car dropped him off. On the morning of 22-3-45 (?) he finds himself at [REDACTED] Postamt Goetzingen 440550 (Sheet 24), 1 km. N of Rankweil, on the E side of the highway from Feldkirch to Goetzingen. He is walking North. If questioned S of the road fork above Lindau, he is on the way to see [REDACTED]. If questioned N of the fork, he has already seen him.

From the viewpoint on, therefore, his route is Goetzingen-Bunzlau-Bregenz-Lindau-Haagingen-Ulm-Aalen and out.

He carries:

1. His Werksausweis of [REDACTED], 12-2-45
2. Entlassungsschein by [REDACTED]
3. Vollmacht, 15-3-45.
4. Letter from company telling him to get pay from [REDACTED], 17-3-45.
5. Request for travel order, 27-3-45.
6. Reiseauftragsnachweis, 19-3-45.
7. Reisegenehmigung.
8. Reichsmarken for 10 days.
9. 1000 Reichsmarken.

If questioned about his destination after having received his pay from [REDACTED] he will say that he is going to Dietenheim, S of Ulm, to get his mother and wife and take them to Rosenheim, farther from the front. States that on his previous trips he had no trouble with military authorities, and that only when a few kilometres from the front did he have to travel cross country to avoid being taken for the Volksgarden.
