National Intelligence Estimate



We believe that President Pinochet is determined to remain in office beyond March 1989, despite his low popularity, opposition from non-Army members of the four-man Junta, and mounting unease in the armed forces. Whether he can achieve his objective is uncertain and is likely to remain so for some months. Pinochet's persistence in trying to perpetuate himself in power is likely to jeopardize US interests in promoting a full and stable democratic transition in Chile.
