MENDRANDUM FOR THE PRESIDENT

SUBJECT: Soviet Bloc Petroleum

In response to your request for additional information about Soviet bloc oil production, consumption, and exports, the Soviet Union is estimated to have had 115.3 million metric tons of petroleum available for all purposes in 1958. In 1958, the USSR used (including refining losses) a total of 99.9 million metric tons, leaving 15.4 million metric tons available for exports. The Russians exported a total of 9.4 million metric tons to the Free World, of which 6.1 million metric tons were exported to Europe.

In 1965, we estimate the UESR will have 235 million metric tons available. Russian use will require an estimated 187 million metric tons, leaving 48 million metric tons available for export. We estimate 28 million metric tons could be exported to the Free World, of which 20 million metric tons annually (400,000 barrels per day) would be evailable for export to Europe.
