In view of the importance I place upon working out with you the program for our covert operations in support of American policy in 3.4(b)(1)>25yrs South Viet Nam, I have asked who is intimately familiar with the matter and who has my full confidence, to go to Saigon and discuss the matter with you. I felt this was particularly timely in view of the discussions incident to the Bangkok-SEATO Conference and the Manila conversations which may set the course of what we do in this area in meeting the Communist threat. Naturally, all the resources we can make available will be at your disposal for this purpose.

> We all feel here that you have accomplished extraordinary results and have brought hope in a situation which seemed desperate a few months ago. We all sincerely regret that circumstances make it impossible for you to stay on longer, but understand fully the reasons therefor and wish to benefit during these coming weeks from your guidance in setting a course for the future.

If there are any matters which E0 12958 feels he should refer 3.4(b)(1)>25Yrsback here, we will be at the other end of the line to send prompt replies, but I am anxious that matters should be settled on the spot and I am giving full authority to take action in agreement with you.
