* The Govt continues to reorient forces to the north as Kurdish forces continue attempts to isolate the key strategic centers of Kirkuk and Mosul. Regime security in the Baghdad area and maintaining control of Kirkuk and Mosul appear to be the Govt's primary objectives at this point. Scattered fighting continues throughout the south, with significant fighting near Karbala, Ad Dawaniyah, and 50km west of Baghdad.

The military situation in the South ...

* Govt pacification efforts continue in south, with military activity noted in several cities, but most activity seems to have displaced to rural areas around the Karbala-An Najaf areas and other rural areas. Despite Govt claims to successes and control of cities in the South, a better term to use might be that Govt forces occupy certain cities but do not control them.
