- A. To capture and control the Quatemalan labor and peasant movement through HISOWN action.
 - 1. Through training of qualified individuals well conversant with management of union activities and the place of the union in the economic and political complexof the nation.
 - 2. Through the further training by individuals contioned in (1) of cells within the Guatemalan labor movement to work for peaceful capture of the unions.
 - 3. Through the manipulation of labor organizations along lines of positive political and economic action.
 - 4. By creating an atmosphere of hemispheric and world-wide support for the anti-Communist Gustemalans through the use of the facilities of the []complex.
- If necessary, to utilize trained labor people for EUHOOK action.
 - 1. Along lines, to neutralize the labor militia of the Communists.
 - 2. To supplement the general KUSDON activity of PHSUUJESC.

II. UTILIZATION OF [] AND LATIN AMERICAN NEOR PRESUCCESS
A. Despite the indecisior of the I I within the
structure of the organization ar. the most militant of the anti-
Communist labor elements in the Himisphere. It is believed that []
offers KUDARK many potential assets for development by PBSUCCESS.
1. The L has advocated the establishment
of a Committee of Latin ame ican Trade Unionists in Exile. A
meeting will be convened in the near future composed of representa-
tives of Exile groups. It is suggested that the anti-Communist
Guatemalan trade unionists in exile in contact with PBSUCCESS
and other KUBARK facilities take the initiative in the formation
of this committee. In this manner the Guatemalans could ally

themselves with those arti-Communits of the left which heretofore have believed that it was only the forces of the right that opposed the Arbenz regime. It is believed that by participating in such a posmittee the Guatemalans would do much to dissipate the fears of the Latin America: left as to the nature of the opposition to the prosent Guatemalar government. In addition, the committee could be used as a sounding board for PBSUCCESS purposes and aid the Quetenelans in developing the confidence of L I in their cause, sincerity, and dedication to trade unionism. In this marmer a much desired close working relationship with the more militant I could be developed. Participation anti-Communist elements in the work of the committee could furthermore tend to give the Quatemalan exiles a more-anti-totalitarian complexion rather than an exclusively anti-Communist one.

- 2. Since I I people enter Guatemala freely, a proper relationship could be made to utilize their contacts and others known to PBSUCCESS within the country. It does not necessarily follow that the Committee per se would be aware of the activities of the Guatemalans in exile in relationship to clandestine activities, but that participation in the work of the Committee could develop important contacts and agent possibilities to further the work of PBSUCOESS.
- B. Basic to any lawor plan, however, is the training up of a cadre of militants to work within and without Guatemala for PBSUCCEUS. The following method for achieving this task is advocated:
