SUBJECT: Request for Agent Training Material for Field Use

1. In reply to your memorandum dated 5 January 1954, subject as above, it has been determined in consultation with a representative of Staff C, FI that the following materials may be transmitted to WH Division for use as indicated:

a. Classified training materials listed in Attachment A are to be used in the United States as refresher material for an American contract agent prior to his departure for the field and will be used and stored at a KUBARK installation in the United States.

b. Unclassified materials listed in Attachment B will be used by the above-mentioned contract agent in the field as a guide in training indigenous personnel. In this connection Staff C points out that charts and manuals showing United States armed services origin constitute a serious compromise factor to project PBSUCCESS unless properly safeguarded.

2. It is noted that customary procedure for obtaining publications originating with the armed services is to request them from OCD. However, in view of the urgency of the present request the Office of Training is providing the publications from its files.

3. Your attention is invited to Clandestine Services Notice 25-3 which establishes procedure for submitting requests for training materials to the Director of Training.
