- The first letter announcing the Congresstor ther with the invitation 8. except for two PROUDE aponts, was one of express pleasure. They were particularly hance to receive this letter as it indicated that the committee is now getting intermeticael recognition. The weak point appeared, however, when one or two of the completee members mentioned that the committee address had not been given any nublicity and they wondered how the Lexican organization had hourd about them. - C. During the first few days in May a second letter was received from Mexico advising that the Mexican organization would pay for the transportation expenses of three delegates. The committee's first reaction

was that it should not at its very start indebt itself to enother organization. However, several members soon manifested an interest in attending this congress but because of the parade it was decided that the invitation would be given to a prominent anti+Communist in the city. Accordingly, two men from Tapproached the editor of La Republica with the invitation at which time they asked him whether he had read the material left beforehand and when he was going to publish it. He said that the material looked good but that he was not certain of the bong fides of the Mexican organization, adding that this appeared to be a manner in which regular Communist front organizations worked. He advised the committee to take no action until the bone fides of the Congress could be determined and that he would not print any hing until the receipt of such information. These remarks sobered the enthusiasm of the committee members and they began to wonder about the legitimacy of the congress. Consequently they decided to send a cable on 4 May to the Cardinal in Dexico informing him that they had received the invitation and requesting his advice as to the advisability of attending. A reply has not yet been received.

- 5. The editor of La República brought up an intere ting point. He examined both Mexican letters quite carefully and pointed out that the offer to may the expenses of three delegates was on a form letter with just the name filled in at the top. He said the snonsoring organization must be extremely wealthy if it was inviting delegates from all over latin America at its expense, drawing this inference from the fact that the invitation was on a form letter. This aroused his suspicious as to the legitimedy of the sponsoring organization. The committee members discussed this at length and they too were awazed at the encunt of money it would take to send delegates from all latin America to Texaco to attend this concress.
