Mexico:	President Orders Rebel Leaders' Arrest
	Mexican Federal Judicial Police have arrested eight Zapatista National Liberation Army (EZLN) leaders and, according to press reports, have mounted a manhunt for rebel leader Marcos. President Zedillo justified the moves in a televised address last night in which he revealed Marcos's true identity and the discovery in Mexico City and Veracruz of extensive arms caches and armed EZLN elements preparing for attacks. — Zedillo stopped short of directing a military offensive but ordered increased patrolling in Chiapas; violence could quickly escalate, however, given the Zapatista rank-and-file militancy and ongoing land disputes between peasants and landowners.
	Although Zedillo reiterated the government's commitment to resolving the conflict peacefully, the arrest of top insurgent leaders will create a vacuum in the EZLN leadership, seriously complicating future government efforts to renew peace talks. Zedillo has pledged to call a special session of Congress to report on the situation and to consider legislation that would provide amnesty to rebels agreeing to turn in their weapons. —Already shaky financial markets almost certainly will react negatively to Zedillo's moves.
