

BIOLOGICAL/CHEMICAL WARFARE

Cubans Receive CW Training at Soviet Schools: Over 100 Cubans have attended the Military Academy of Chemical Defense in Moscow since 1965. Courses at the Academy are given for periods varying from one and a half to five years. A like number of Cubans attended the Minsk Higher Radio-Technical Engineering School of PVO Strany Troops. Courses at the school include training in CW defensive measures as well as weapons of mass destruction, electronics, and principles of transmitters and receivers.

Comment: Some Cuban students are known to have been in CW training for over two years; it cannot be established whether any have taken the complete five year course. Cuba now has a sizeable nucleus of CW personnel for regular army employment and for the CW training of troops in Cuba. This is in accord with Cuban CW activity of various types. A recent Cuban exercise involved repulse of an amphibious landing wherein use of chemicals was simulated.
