	Supporters of Megawati Sukarnoputri, the daughter of former President Sukarno, have staged numerous protests since last month's government-engineered ouster of their leader as head of the opposition Indonesia Democratic Party (PDI). Her loyalists, who still occupy party headquarters in Jakarta, staged a demonstration there on Saturday. They are defying calls by the military to turn the building over to the new government-backed PDI leadership. Press reports say that the Army is considering direct intervention to end the crisis.
_	- Protests for independence for East Timor and Irian Jaya may also occur. The East Timorese, in particular, have a history of demonstrations during visits of high-level dignitaries; during the 1994 APEC summit in Jakarta, for example, 29 Timorese youths
	staged a 12-day sit-in at the US Embassy.
