1. PERSONAL DATA:

a. Chronology

31 May 1892 : Born in FORST, in the region of LAUSITZ
1911 : Graduated from high-school in COTTBUS
1911-1914 : Studied law at the Universities of FREIBURG, LEIPZIG and Halle
1914-1917 : Served in the German Army as a reserve lieutenant
1917-1920 : Worked as Regierungsreferendar with the Regierungspräsident in STETTIN. Appointed Regierungsassessor in 1920.
Nov 1920-Fall 1921 : Active with the Landrat of HALLE/Saale as Regierungsassessor and administrative assistant (Hilfsarbeiter).
Fall 1921-End 1922 : Same capacity with the Prussian Ministry of the Interior
1922-1923 : Same capacity with the Landrat of Nauen. Appointed Regierungsrat at ESSEN in 1923
1923-1926 : Regierungsassessor and administrative assistant with the Prussian Ministry of Commerce
1926-1928 : Landrat at FREYSTADT in Lower Silesia
1928-1932 : Ministerialrat with the Prussian Ministry of Commerce
1932-1936 : Ministerialdirektor with the Prussian Ministerpräsident (Prime Minister)
1936-Jun 1942 : Staatssekretär (Under Secretary of State) with the Foreign Exchange Committee under the Commissioner of the Four-Year Plan
Jun 1942 : Became Generaldirektor of the Deutsches Kali-Syndikat G.m.b.H. (German Potash Syndicate)

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b. Memberships

MEULLIN was a member of the board of directors of the following concerns:

- (2) 1934-1942 : Deutsche Revisions & Treuhand A.G., BERLIN
- (3) 1941-1945 : Continental Oel A.G., BERLIN

- (5) 1943-1945 : Reichsbank
- (6) 1943-1945 : Continental Handelsbank, KESTERDORF

Subject joined the Party in 1933. He received the honorary rank of an SS Standartenfuehrer and was promoted to honorary SS Oberfuehrer in 1936. He claims that he was never active in either organization since he objected to anything that would interfere with his duties.

2. ADMINISTRATIVE DUTIES

MEULLIN was arrested by the 510th C.I.C. Det. at GARMISCH-PARTENKIRCHEN on 10 May 45 and held by 7th Army Interrogation Center from 13 May 45 until 10 Sep 45. At that time he was transferred to this Center. He carried with him a report entitled "The Four Year Plan". Results of personality card index check: yellow SHAEF cards Nos. 83350 and 83351.

3. KNOWLEDGE; BELIEF

Subject appears well versed in questions of the economic development of Germany from the post World War I period until the present time. He seems familiar with the workings of the Four Year Plan, especially its foreign exchange aspects. He should have extensive knowledge on the activities of the German Potash Syndicate and its constituents, as well as many personalities of industry, Party and possibly Wehrmacht.

4. INTERROGATION PLAN

It is planned to interrogate MEULLIN on subjects listed in para 3. In addition he will be questioned on his possible knowledge of industrial exploitation of occupied countries, complicity of industrialists in war guilt, his opinions on the reasons for Germany's defeat, his attitude towards the present occupying powers and his ideas on the economic rehabilitation of Germany.

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5. COMMENTS AND RECOMMENDATIONS

Prisoner will be interrogated along the lines of briefs already received; however, recipients of this report are requested to submit special briefs of any subject upon which the prisoner should be interrogated and to indicate the desired distribution of the resultant report.

1. REFERENCES

2. REASON FOR REPORT

In answer to brief: "Questionnaire for NEUMANN", IN PIAT RP 254-52 (NEUMANN) dated 22 Oct 45.

3. REPORT

a. Introduction.

NEUMANN did not assume the position of General Director of the German Kali Syndicate until 1942, and was not connected with the Syndicate prior to that time. He is unable therefore to reply with exactness to questions concerning the Kali industry in the years 1933-1939.

b. Answers to Brief

(1) Source estimates that 1.5 million tons of K₂O were produced annually in Germany in the years 1933-1939. The corresponding amount of crude ore can be calculated as follows: The raw material contains K₂O in amounts varying between 10 and 20%. Average content runs closer to the lower of these figures. Consequently, source believes, 12% would be a good average yield, bringing annual average output of crude ore to approximately 13 million tons for this period.

NEUMANN is unable to quote any production figures for the Durbach Werke and Kali Chemie A.G. He refers instead to Bergrat a.D. MANNICKE in NISSENHEIM, who should be able to give detailed information. MANNICKE was once head of the planning group for Kali (Reichsstelle fuer Kali).

(2) The vast majority of the German production of Kali in the years 1933-1939 was used for the manufacture of fertilizers. Source thinks it improbable that more than 5% of the production was used for industrial purposes. Nearly all of the fertilizer was a refined product which contained K₂O in amounts ranging between 20 and 50%. A K₂O content was perhaps most in demand. Small amounts of the unrefined ore were used in the elimination of weeds (Hederich-Kainit product).

(3) Compound fertilizers were used only to a limited extent in Germany. Compound fertilizers were manufactured by the Kali Chemie A.G. (Ehenanxia Phosphat), by Wintershall A.G. (mixture of potash and nitrogen), and by the I.G. Farbenindustrie (nitrophoska - mixture of nitrogen, phosphorous and potassium). Compound fertilizers of Kali and Phosphorus were used before seeding, while Nitrogen mixtures were used as head-fertilizer (Kopfdmenger) and about young plants.

(4) For information on pits in use and production figures during the war, source refers to the files of the German Kali Syndicate and to the Planning Group for Kali (Reichsstelle fuer Kali). MANNICKE (see above) should also be able to answer this question.

(5) The Kali industry relied principally upon hard coal as fuel. Only the Wintershall works had converted partially to soft coal, which required a different stove grate. The coal supply for the industry was handled up to the last by the Planning Group for Kali in conjunction with the Planning Group for Coal. Consult MANNICKE on this question.

(6) For information on production of by-products, source suggests a Dr. D'ABES,

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who headed the Kali research institute (Kali Forschungsanstalt) in the building of the German Kali Syndicate in BERLIN. Dr. D'ASS is, according to NEUMANN, a Belgian but most likely a naturalized citizen of Germany. He was last known to reside in BERLIN.

(7) For information on production of bromine, source refers to the files of the department "By-Products" of the German Kali Syndicate. These files were last in the syndicate building in BERLIN. Dr. D'ASS is also engaged in connection with this subject.

(8) Up to the final phase of the war, no damage had been suffered by the manufacturing facilities for bromine. Paralysis of the German transportation system did bring bromine production to a complete halt.

4. COMMENTS AND RECOMMENDATIONS

An final interrogation report on NEUMANN is in preparation.

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
