- 1. Referenced memorandum requests a USIB appraisal of the subversive insurgency situation in Pakistan, with particular emphasis on the Communist threat in East Pakistan.
- 2. For many years, various elements in East Pakistan have resented the greater influence and authority of West Pakistan in the country's affairs and have sought increased local autonomy. This has from time to time given rise to riots and demonstrations in East Pakistan, most recently in mid-September 1962. The leadership of these various movements is non-Communist, though the situation is of course subject to Communist exploitation.
- 3. Karachi TOAID 668 of 24 September, cited in referenced document, suggests an increase in the USAID's Public Safety program

4. This latter judgment is confirmed in the Department of State memorandum for the Special Group (CI) (also cited in referenced memorandum) which also reflects the opinion of the recently returned Charge d'Affairs.

6. We do not believe that the threat of Communist insurgency in Pakistan is an urgent or immediate one. We recommend that the USIB not undertake at this time an appraisal of the internal security situation in Pakistan, until the receipt of the coordinated views of the US Ambassador to Pakistan and his Country Team.
