- 3. In the spring of 1941 Subject left his pistons for a month's leave at his home in Toktamukei, Gaucasus. He travelled by train and calims to have injured his right hip, thus requiring hospitalization at the Krasnoder Military Hospital on Koncomalary Street. He remained there until the outbreek of war with Sermeny in June 1941.
- 3. After being discharged from the Hospital Subject reported to a meassignment center in Krusnoder and was sent to the 113rd Regiment of the 56th Division and stationed between Tightenakes and Hostow on the Don. His Commanding Officer was Lt. 201. SYAFAVOLUV (phon.) In Merch 1942 he was wounded in the right shoulder while flighting against the Germans and was sent to Orsk in Azerbaijan. In July he was ordered to the Crimen but claims that, like other Coucasians, he deserted and remained in the Krasnoder area. In August, the Germans reached Krasnoder and Subject was appointed as an assistant chief in the Gircassian Field Gendarmerie in Toktemukal. He was under the Command of Lt. Gen. You FORESEN and Hajor Yon KORHOTSKY, and held that position until the end of 1942. He was charged with collecting Red Army uniforms and impages. - . In the early part of 1943 Subject joined Worth Caucasian Sattalion 835 in Kalushinsky, which is located about 30 kms. from Toktamuhai. This unit was composed entirely of Generales and operated under a commando group which scouted Russian positions and engaged in demolition work. An Abadzak Circussian named DZEFTSCH TUGUS held an important position in this unit. Subject states that TUGUS was from Toktamuhai and had escaped into Finland during the Russo-Finnish fighting. He was subsequently used by the Germans to organize the special Caucasian unit which was sent to the Caucasus.
- 6. When the Germans retreated in Ferch 1943, TWGUS recommended Subject to the Ger-6. In 1947 Subject obtained King Abdullah's permission for the admission of the group to Jorden, and departed from Italy in November of 1947.

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
