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- Mela RANCWSKA was also a contact of Herman FIELD from the days when Herman had his committee (Komitet Uchodczow) in Poland to assist Czechoslovakians to leave Czechoslovakia after that country had been annexed by Germany. Herman FIELD called Mela GRANOWSKA and asked her to assist him GRANOWSKA a branch chief in obtaining a visa to Poland. in the Personnel Section of the Ministry of Energy. GRANOWSKA was alarmed by this request and reported it to Lunay BRYSTYGIER of MBP Department V. GRANOWSKA knew BRYSTYGIER from their ZPP (Union of Polish Patriots) days in Moscow. BRYSTYGIER reported this incident and BIERUT decided that GRANOWSKA should call Herman FIELD in Prague. GRANOWSKA was instructed to tell Herman that she would try to obtain the visa, and if she were successful, Herman was to plan to stay with GRANCWSKA while he was in Poland. These instructions were carried out and BRYSTYGIER recruited GRANOWSKA as an MBP agent.
- 5. Herman FIELD arrived in Poland and was escorted by GRANCWSKA to visit Helena CYRKUS and Col. Leon GECOW. Source claims that Herman became acquainted with GECOW in Switzerland. GECOW was president of the Polish Red Cross at the time of his arrest in the FIELD case. Herman FIELD speaks German and all of his conversations in Poland were conducted in the German language.
- When Herman FIELD was scheduled to leave Poland, he was escorted to the Warsaw Airport by Helena CYRKUS and GRANOWSKA. CYRKUS left the airport first and when GRANOWSKA left, Herman started walking toward the Prague airplane. At this point, Herman FIELD was arrested by the MEP.
- 7. The MBP waited until this moment in order to permit Herman FIELD to officially pass through customs and officially be listed as a passenger. Since the arrest took place under such circumstances the Poles can deny knowledge of Herman's whereabouts.
 - It. Col. PIASECKI of Department X conducted the interrogation of Herman FIELD. In an attempt to force Herman to confess, PIASECKI read him excerpts from the RAJK trial and told him that his brother Noel had testified against Allen DULLES and other American intelligence agents. At no point in the interrogation did Herman FIELD admit that he was a spy or that he had ever conducted espionage on behalf physical violence has not of the American Government. Lt. Col. PIASECKI drew up the formal been used against Herman FIELD. charges against Herman, and this statement of charges has excerpts from the RAJK trial. Herman maintains that he is and has been a true Communist

The fact that Herman helped Communists to leave Czechoslovakia during 1939 is not taken into consideration by the Poles. was also active in Communist work in Switzerland during the war.

	The only evidence against Herman FIELD is guilt by association. He did belong to the USC (Unitarian Services Committee), which the Foles consider to be a cover agency for American intelligence, and his brother was an espionage agent. HERUT hinted that it would be convenient if Herman were eliminated but such a hint could not be interpreted as an order or even as a suggestion. Such a statement is usually understood to mean that the officers in charge could arrange a convenient method for eliminating Herman provided they took full responsibility in the event that any complications occurred.
11.	Herman was becoming nervous and his mental state was deteriorating. He also threatened to commit suicide and had gone on several hunger strikes.

,	The Hungarians stated that they had no interest in Herman FIELD and would not accept him.
13.	a report concerning the Herman FIELD case, in which he stated that Herman might attempt to take his own life and since he had admitted nothing and no evidence had been uncovered he should be considered innocent and should be protected. The report had to be placed in the official files. The existence of such a written statement of innocence made it almost impossible for anyone to assume the responsibility of becoming his executioner
14.	the United States has exchanged notes with Poland concerning the location of Herman FIELD. The Poles deny that Herman FIELD is in their custody, Herman FIELD was in prison in Miedzeszyn, Poland. BIERUT told ROMKOWSKI that "Herman FIELD is to remain in prison in Poland until the Communist revolution takes place in the United States". This was stated in a sarcastic vein and was meant to denote that Herman is never to be released.
