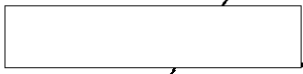

2. The International War Crimes Tribunal has been of some value "if, like some demonstrations, it created confusion" (presumably in the United States). [redacted] said he did not think that Tribunal members Isaac Deutscher and Gunther Anders understood the "racist aspect" of United States' participation in the Vietnam War.

3. It is requested that no action be taken on the basis of this information without prior coordination with this agency.

Comment: [redacted] was considerably annoyed at the high-brow intellectual politics of the "French group" of the Tribunal.
