[redacted] KOMARAKA had fled Czechoslovakia and claimed to have in his possession secret documents entrusted to him by Jan MASARYK for delivery to the United States Government. The nature of the documents is unknown.

4. KOMARAKA is presumably identical with Vit KOMARAK, subject of your memorandum of 29 November 1948. He is a former high school teacher of about 40 to 45 years of age who escaped from Czechoslovakia in June 1948 and was closely associated with the SOKOL movement. To the knowledge of officials of this agency, he was never close to Jan MASARYK and it is sincerely doubted that he was ever entrusted with such a mission by MASARYK.
