Although Subject is wealthy enough to have paid his own way to Khartoum, it is believed that the World Council of Peace defrayed all expenses. Subject did attend the meeting in Khartoum and is presently working again in San Francisco. He traveled to Khartoum with Irving ARNOFF of Los Angeles.
