Gramtrade International Corporation Situation
and Specifically, agreement dated February 6,
1943, between Major Ronald H. Pearce and
W. A. Barrett, Jr., Covering Rental of Suite
1514, 1250 Sixth Avenue.

From our talk yesterday I understand you agree with
my convictions that:

(1) The entire history of relationship and engagements
between CSC and Gramtrade should be reviewed by you and recom-
mendations made as to whether or not the CSC has any valid
claims against Gramtrade and, if so, whether they should be
pressed. As I told you, my guess is that we have grounds for
action but that doubtless they should be ignored because
of circumstances and probable conversations between Major Bruce
and Colonel Amoss, with which I am not familiar.

(2) That the lease made on February 6 between Pearce and
Barrett should be undone because, in effect, this can be inter-
preted as relief for Gramtrade (Debtors) from CSC (Creditor).
You also felt, as I do, that the \$150 payment should be recovered
by CSC, together with all rentals paid to date by Pearce (which
is to say, \$50) under the terms of Pearce's agreement of February
6 with Barrett. Incidentally, the rental bills of Pearce have
come in on Gramtrade's stationery and Pearce's checks have been
made out to Gramtrade, although the rental agreement was signed
by Barrett as an individual.

I understand you will talk to me directly after
analyzing this matter so that we may carefully consider it be-
fore any steps are taken by any office. Otherwise, we might
do Pearce or Amoss an injustice. In short, after you have
reviewed the matter, I want the whole picture carefully passed
on by Shitzky, Shoppardson, Colonel Amoss, and John Hughes.

Thanks for your help.
