DAILY BRIEF 30 NOVEMBER 1964

1. Congo

No significant changes have been reported since yesterday.

2. USSR

3. Cuba

Saturday night Cuban guards harassed Guantanamo by throwing rocks, rattling the fence, and firing a few shots into the base. We have long expected a Cuban diplomatic offensive against the US. Saturday's activity could be the first move to stir up the Guantanamo issue.

- 4. South Vietnam
- No new developments have been reported.
- 5. Common Market

Bonn is expected to tell the EEC tomorrow that it agrees to unified grain prices. A German official says Bonn may try to bargain, but will probably accept the EEC's recommended price.

6. USSR

If successful, the Soviet space probe launched this morning should reach the vicinity of Mars about 7 August 1965. We are not yet sure, however, that it has escaped the malfunctions that have plagued previous Soviet space probe attempts.

7. India

Soviet-Indian differences are holding up work on India's MIG air-craft engine plane, begun in September 1963 but now barely beyond the foundation stage. The Soviets want to limit the Indian production role to assembling parts, to which New Delhi objects.

8. Tanganyika

Nyerere says he will prohibit further public mention of the alleged US involvement in plotting against him. He has not, however, denounced the false documents.
