

propaganda to the militantly leftist youth group in the Nationalist Revolutionary Movement. This is President Paz's party, but the youth group is a much more extremist faction. Members of the youth organization were very much in evidence at the Cuban embassy's reception commemorating the Bay of Pig's invasion, boasting of having plastered the capital with pro-Cuban posters.

E. Argentina The Guido government now believes its timetable for national elections will be generally adhered to. This calls for the parties to name their candidates by early next month and elections on 23 June. It has abandoned efforts to generate an electoral front and will let the parties go ahead and put up candidates of their own, but it is still trying to persuade the Peronist Popular Union party not to put up candidates for president, vice president, and certain governorships.
