

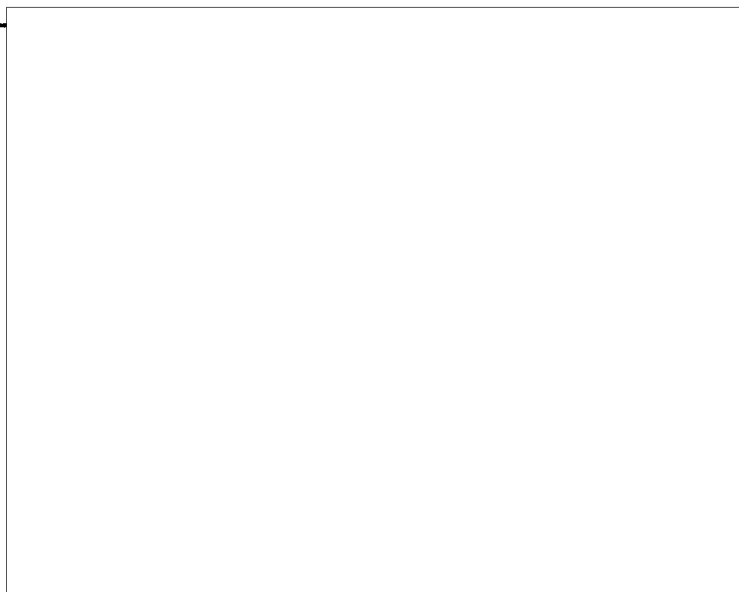

a. A Soviet ship recently delivered tanks, armored vehicles, large mortars, and anti-tank guns to Hudaydah. Some of this equipment may be replacements for destroyed Egyptian equipment.

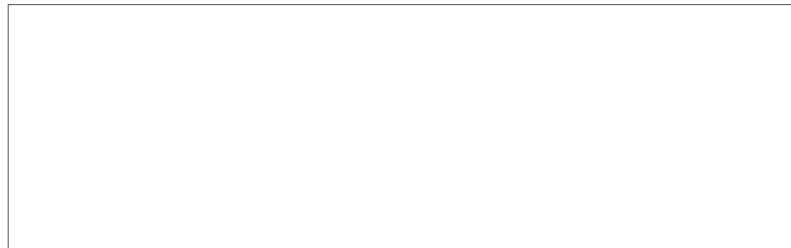

dispute**

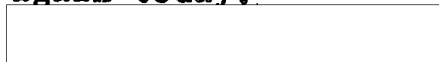

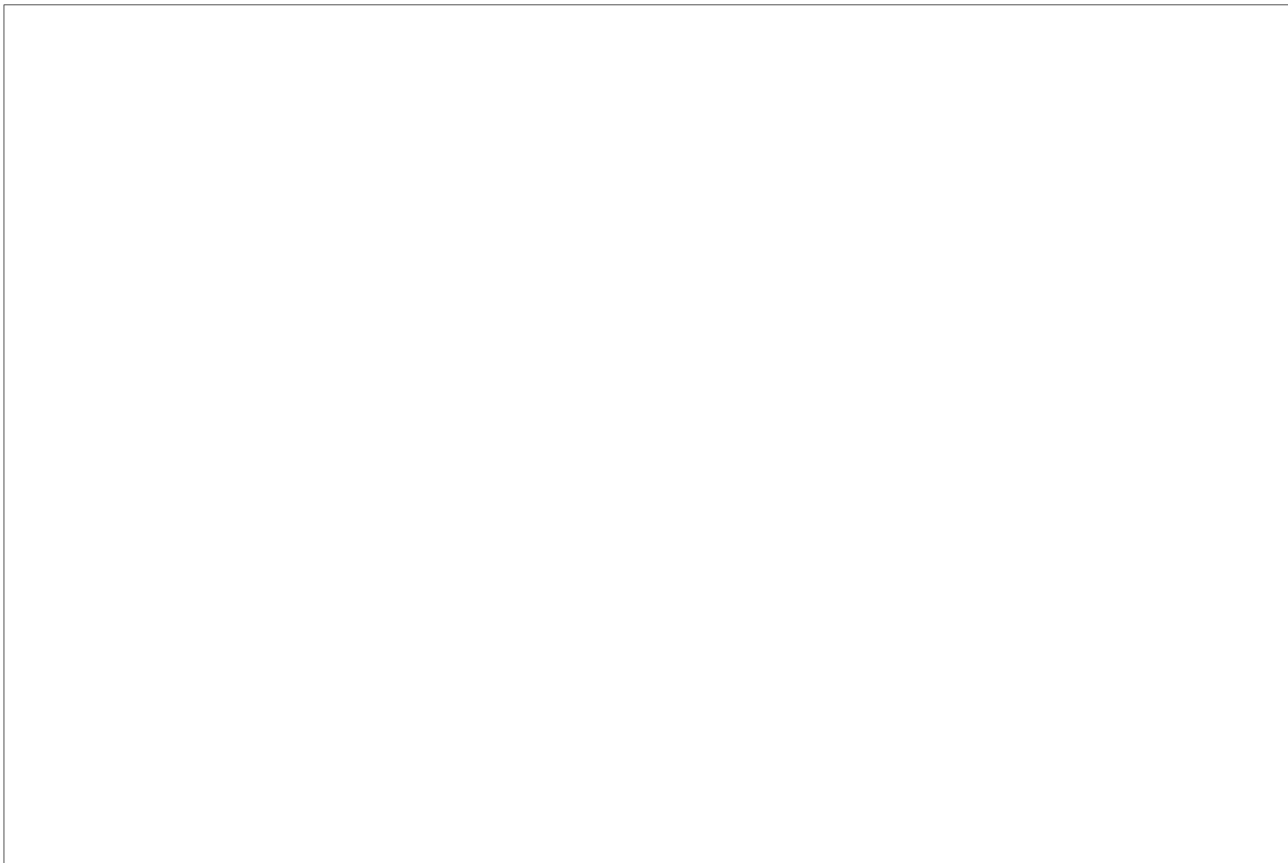
b. The Soviet party is clearly on the defensive. Its reply to the tightly-reasoned Chinese letter is a mixture of emotional appeals to popular sentiment against nuclear war, the materialism of the new Soviet bourgeoisie, and plain Russian nationalism.

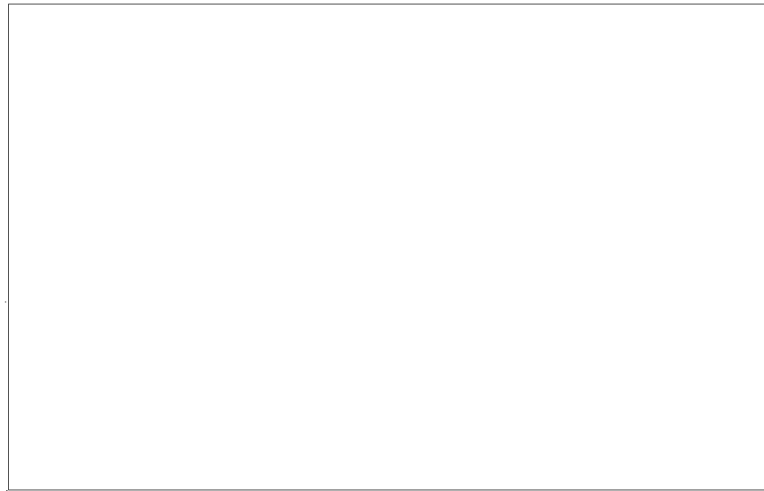

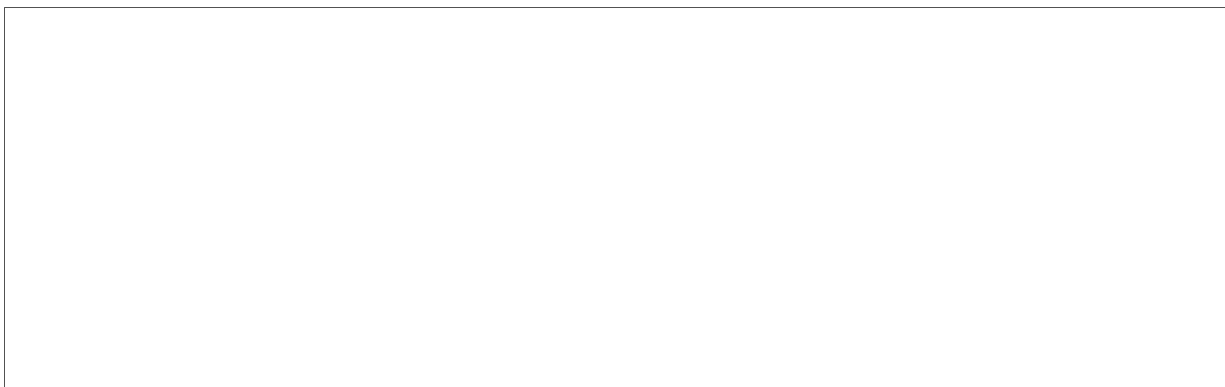
