SUMMARY OF INFORMATION

SUBJECT: Clandestine Political Organization in British/U.S. Zone, FTT.

1. A reliable informant of this office recently reported the following information concerning the existence of a clandestine political organization in British/U.S. Zone, FTT. (B-3)
November 1950.

2. Attached to this report is an original membership card of an organization known as "Gruppo D'Azione Trieste Italiana (G.D.A.I. Trieste)". This membership card was received from GUAL, Alessandro, a refugee from SLOVENIA, who now resides at Via Galvani 27, Trieste, and the family name is GUAL.

3. GUAL became a member of the organization under the following circumstances. As a Yugoslav refugee, GUAL found it difficult to obtain a travel permit to visit ITALY. With this problem in mind, he contacted BRICH, Milan, who resides at Via Galvani 7, Trieste, and related his desire to visit ITALY and the difficulties he was encountering. During the conversation BRICH stated that if GUAL would become a member of an Italian movement in Trieste (G.D.A.I.), he would receive assistance in obtaining travel documents for ITALY. It was agreed that GUAL would join the organization and that he would submit a biographical sketch of his personal particulars to BRICH. Several days later BRICH instructed GUAL to contact GIANNI, Gianni, at Caffè Garibaldi in Trieste. At this meeting, on 25 July 1950, GUAL was handed the accompanying membership card after paying a membership fee of 5,000 lire. According to a statement made by BRICH, the 5,000 lire membership fee is used for propaganda purposes by the G.D.A.I. organization.

4. After joining the movement, GUAL, Alessandro, was informed by BRICH that he would be given a letter of introduction

4. On 17, 18, and 19 November, 1950, conferences of Gabriele HUNGER, the first architect and sculptor of ITALY, will be in Trieste for three lectures on the following subjects:

- (1) On 17 November 1950 at the Circolo It-ASIA: "Italy and the movement towards peace"
- (2) On 18 November 1950 at the Circolo "Mondadori" on "Italy and the movement towards peace"
- (3) On 19 November 1950 at Circolo del Part on "Giuseppe Penone, the artist and the movement."

Subject: Soviet Agricultural Delegation

1. The following information was received from a confidential source on 10 November 1950. (S) (C-)

During the month of October 1950, a Soviet Agricultural Delegation consisting of thirty-five persons arrived in BULGARIA. The delegation was headed by the Vice Director General Administration of Hybrid Breeding in the USSR, G. G. Gerasimov. Also included in the delegation were the heads of the Soviet "Collective" and "Sovkhoz", the Director of the Collective Agricultural Stations and numerous "Experts of Soviet Agriculture". During its sojourn in BULGARIA, the delegation visited the large collective farms where the delegates were cordially received by various Bulgarian agricultural organizations. These organizations were to furnish technical advice to Bulgarian farmers which would enable the latter to increase agricultural production. The advice, in turn, was to be given by the Bulgarian specialists of the delegation who were sent to various parts of the country. Newspapers also state that the Bulgarian Ministry of Agriculture will "ensure a happy existence for the delegation and its work."

On 6 October 1950, the delegation met in Sofia and conferred at length with the Bulgarian Ministry of Agriculture. Delegates discussed upon various aspects of Bulgarian agriculture and offered "advice of an incalculable value" to the Ministry. The Bulgarian Minister of Agriculture, Dimitar V. V. V. was present at this conference along with numerous other Bulgarian agricultural officials. G. G. G. thanked the Soviet delegation for its assistance and advice and stated that its recommendations would be carefully studied and acted upon so that Bulgarian agriculture would be reorganized upon a firm and co-operative basis. This re-organization was to be carried out with the present attitude of Bulgarian farmers who are urged to "return to labor and not to the black market in order to survive."

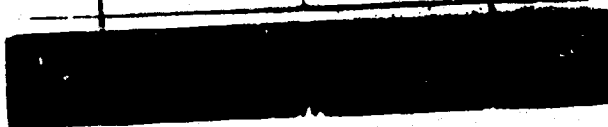
