X-75, Karlo, (originally identified with 725), Karlo who represents one of the two principal groups of Croatian Nationalist elements at Turnoli between Crotia and Sicily. 725 (op) leads the other group. This group wishes to remain in Sicily at present but aims for union with resistance forces in Crotia in not too distant future. Subject was contacted by Karlo-725 (770) via our own units about January 1947 and obtained a copy of (code) "Operative Instructions" prepared in contact with an American source which will furnish arms and equipment for resistance into Crotia. In an attempt of altered entity between 725 and 770, both have the same courier, Stojan Vlasic. This and the identity of those products leads source to infer that the two centers of separated networks all originating with the same American agent, Stojan Vlasic, whose activities, a strong American interest to dispatch trained personnel and equipment into Crotia.

Information in report on activities of Valer Stojan Vlasic, Turnoli 75, Stojan Vlasic et al. 20 January 1947.

Turnoli, Stojan. Chief spokesman for other group of Croatian Nationalist elements at Turnoli which wishes to remain in Sicily at any cost also. Subject states that in the Spring (1947) he intends to attempt to enter Crotia clandestinely for purpose of joining the resistance. Subject promises his own contacts equipment and armament from, he states, Allied sources. Subject states that his courier to Crotia, Lie 770 (code 725, Karlo above) has been arrested by Italian police. At one time was to have proceeded to Crotia on a clandestine anti-770 mission.
