Source: A person who maintains he was a member of the Argentine Intelligence

is believed to be identical to Father Stjepan DRAGANOVIC, Stefano ERCOLI and the address Via Oslania 28, Rome.

regularly visits the Argentine Embassy in Rome for the object of passing visas for refugees and displaced persons to Argentina.

Source was employed as an intelligence agent by Colonel Arnaldo Argentine Military Attache in Rome, to investigate the activities of

Source, Subject, although posing as an anti-Communist, is in contact with and directs an intelligence net whose agents are located in the United States and perhaps other countries. The following names of Subject and members of his net was developed by Source:

DRAGANOVICH, (fnu):

According to Source, he is about six feet three inches tall and was head of the Croat secret service during World War II. DRAGANOVICH always meets persons he is not sure of in the San Luis de Franchetti Church on Via Siroga, Rome. His mortal enemy is a Dr. Petar LULIC, Via Matzic Clementi 27, Rome. LULIC was Croat military attache in Berlin during the last war.

GRILITSCH, (fnu):

Secretary of DRAGANOVICH, Via Oslania 28, Rome. GRILITSCH is a Communist agent who has succeeded in penetrating the MSI. GRILITSCH is also in contact with Adriane SCHUBH, a stenographer in the office of Colonel SOSA MOLINA. SCHUBH receives money from GRILITSCH in return for which she passes on information concerning Argentine intelligence activities in Italy.

TRAZONE, (fnu):

Trasone 6, Rome, telephone 880-611, head of the American Friends Service Committee in Rome. An unwitting collaborator of DRAGANOVICH.
