1. Early in August 1954, Dobrosias JEVDEVIC received a visit, without
any warning, from the following two Hungarian political exiles, who
had arrived from Austria:

a. Ex-General Arpad HAMERY (address: Gantebach 104, Fort Britten in
Salz, Tyrol, Austria).

b. Bela FALLER (Address: Arden Hauptstrasse 29, Innsbruck);

2. They informed JEVDEVIC that they had come to Italy for the purpose of
choosing a number of collaborators for a "Fascist International" which
is seen to be constituted with headquarters at Munich, indicating that
JEVDEVIC's address and references in his regard had been given them
by the ex-General COSTA (of the MSI, with whom JEVDEVIC is in contact).
The two Hungarians confided that they would also make contact with the
Metacala priest, Prof. Krumoslav BRAGANOVIC, and with neo-Fascist leaders
of other European countries who are resident in Italy, finally going to
see Eugene Cardinal TISSERANT who is allegedly favorable toward their
anti-Communist activity.

During the talk which took place, JEVDEVIC did not, however, give his
immediate approval because the Hungarians indicated the hope of incorporating
the Yugoslav Voivodina (i) within the Hungarian frontiers and because
Hungarian nazi-fascist killed many thousands of Serbs in the Voivodina during
the last war.

3. A few days ago, JEVDEVIC received a letter from Bela FALLER in which
FALLER urged JEVDEVIC to adhere to the "Fascist International." As a
result of agreements reached with source, JEVDEVIC will ask FALLER for
the statute of the organization and for other matters regarding it.

4. It is pointed out that the Hungarian group (headed by General HAMERY)
publishes a newspaper in Salzburg entitled Die Zeits.
