<p>1. (C) a. On 12 February 1965, Source was debriefed concerning his last meeting with Vlado GODLER, believed to be the First Secretary of the Yugoslavian Trade Mission in West Germany, and a representative of Yugoslavian Intelligence Service. Source reported substantially the following:</p> <p>b. The meeting with GODLER had been scheduled for 5 February 1965 but Source received a postcard from GODLER on 4 February postponing the meeting until 8 February. On 8 February, Source went to Rhein Main Airport, Frankfurt/Main, German Federal Republic (GFR), at 1800 hours and waited in front of the post-office until 1825 hours, at which time GODLER appeared. Source and GODLER went to the airport restaurant where the meeting was held.</p>

c. GODLER asked what Professor Miroslav VAROS has been doing in Germany. Source told him VAROS had visited Stuttgart (WV1405), GFR, where he met with Niko KOVACIC to discuss the plans for writing and printing a newspaper and other anti-Yugoslavian propaganda. VAROS also went to Memminger (LV6767), GFR, to speak with Franjo PAVECIC about the propaganda material and also about the pending meeting of the Hrvatski Demokratski Odbor (Croatian Democratic Committee) (HDO) which is to take place in Frankfurt/Main. VAROS came to Frankfurt/Main, where he met with Source and discussed the upcoming meeting of HDO. VAROS told Source to arrange for a meeting place. The meeting had been scheduled for 20 and 21 February, but has been postponed to 27-28 February. GODLER told Source to do his utmost to get himself elected to the leadership of the HDO if elections were held at the meeting. GODLER asked if Source had obtained a place to the meeting. Source said he had not found a place to hold the meeting as yet. GODLER asked if Source would be able to take a tape recorder with him and secretly record the meeting. Source said he could not tell yet as he still did not know where the meeting would be held. GODLER told Source they would have to meet again before the HDO meeting was held, in order to determine if the tape recorder could be placed in the meeting room.

d. GODLER asked which members of the Hrvatski Revolucionarno Bratstvo, (Croatian Revolutionary Brotherhood) (HRB), from Stuttgart would be coming to the HDO meeting in Frankfurt/Main. Source said he did not know yet as PAVECIC would make the invitations to the HRB and PAVECIC has not spoken with Source about the meeting. GODLER asked whether Gusa PASTY was coming to the meeting, but Source said he did not know. GODLER then said he was going to make trouble for PASTY through the German officials, and attempt to get PASTY thrown out of the country, because he was sure to cause trouble to the Yugoslavian government if allowed to operate freely in West Germany.

e. GODLER said he knew Jure MILOVAC had come to Frankfurt/Main and had seen Source. He asked Source what MILOVAC was doing in Frankfurt/Main. Source told him MILOVAC had just come through on his way to visit PAVECIC in Memminger. While he was here he had met with Source and spoken briefly about the meeting of the HDO to be held soon in Frankfurt/Main.

f. GODLER asked if Source had visited Jure VEZELIC or Sulejman GRABUS. Source said he had written letters to both these men indicating he would like to see them, but to date has not received any answer from them. Source said he would very likely see both these men at the upcoming HDO meeting.

g. GODLER asked if Source has written to or heard from Krimoslav DRAGONOVIC recently. Source said he had sent DRAGONOVIC a card at Christmas, but had had no further communication with him. Source gave GODLER DRAGONOVIC'S present address, a monastery near Vienna (near) Austria: Sacre Coeur, Pressbaum bei Wien, Osterreich. Telephone 427. GODLER asked what DRAGONOVIC is doing now and Source said he is working on a history of some sort and as far as Source knew DRAGONOVIC is no longer active politically.

h. GODLER asked if Source's family in Yugoslavia had applied for a visa to visit West Germany. Source said they had, but had been turned down. GODLER said he had wired instructions that the visas were to be issued, but evidently there had been some mixup. GODLER said he would wire further instructions and told Source to advise his family to reapply for the visas.

i. The meeting lasted until approximately 2000 hours. GODLER set the date of the next meeting for 26 February 1965, at 1800 to 1815 hours at the Boersenkeller Restaurant, Frankfurt/Main. GODLER told Source to return to Frankfurt/Main by himself as someone was coming to pick GODLER up later. Source returned to Frankfurt/Main by bus. No payments were made to Source by GODLER.
