


MEMORANDUM

SUBJECT: UNIKOLIC, Ivan

According to a report dated November 1951 from a usually reliable source, one Jesuit Father Ivan NIKOLIC, who may or may not be identifiable with Subject, had been in Argentina, but had emigrated to the United States two or three years prior to 195i.

- According to Source, while in Argentina NIKOLIC had been a close friend of Dr. Krunoslav DRAGONOVIC, a priest of the Roman Catholic Church, During World War II, DRAGONOVIC performed many missions for Ante PAVELIC, who was the Chief of the Independent State of Croatia under the Nazi regime. At one time DRAGONOVIC were the uniform of an USTASHI (Pro-Fascist Croatian Terrorist Organization) officer in order not to compromise himself as a priest. Later DRAGONOVIC became the delegate of the Croatian Government to the Vatican. After the war DRAGONOVIC facilitated the emigration of many Croatians, principally USTASHI, and several ex- Nazis, who entered Argentina under false names. In 1951 DRAGONOVIC was in favor of an independent Croatian state.
- b. There is no further information to indicate whether NIKOLIC was sympathetic to the political attitude of DRAGONOVIC. If it is determaned
