In connection with the 1963 visit of Yugoslav President Tito to the United States, representatives of the Yugoslav Government furnished to the United States Department of State (USDS) information concerning persons considered hostile to Yugoslav President Tito or the Yugoslav Government.

Information furnished by the Yugoslav Government representatives concerning captioned individual stated that he was included in a group of "well known leaders of the present Ustashi (Croatian fascist terrorist organization) emigration and notorious war criminals" who came from Europe to attend a congress of Ustashi organizations in New York. According to the information furnished, Draganovic traveled to the congress from Italy.

During March, 1949, the USDS advised that a USDS official had learned that one Father Krunoslav Draganovic, a Ustashi priest who found sanctuary in the St. Jerome Monastery in Rome, planned to attend a February 27, 1949, Ustashi congress in Chicago, Illinois. The USDS stated that to their own knowledge, Draganovic has been most active and instrumental in serving as liaison between the Vatican and the Ustashi.
