

- 1. We have already notified you briefly by cable that DT-HLAB has selected identity I as its representative for Indenesia. Identity I was formerly importive director of identity 2 and has been given a years leave of absence from that organization to case up the analygonal with officially. He will depart from San Francisco for Indonesia by ship on 22 July and is scheduled to arrive in Djakarta via ILF on 22 August.
- he had been soloosed. We ware able to present him that simply to marmi to Indenesia as the representative of DPMIJAR would be likely to harn his chances of developing a program in that country because of the Indenesian's deep suspicion of any accepts to influence them. At our suggestion he decided to put the primary complasis on his continuing relationship with Identity 2 and cention his commention with UTPILAR as a consultant to the prosident of that or anisation with the consistion to recommend a program for informatia. Since he can also legitimately marking his commentions with several other self-incom organism tions such as Indentity 3, we feel that the Indenesiate will be less suspicious of him and will therefore give him a better chance to work slewly to publicite OTPILAR.
- 3. An indication of the indemedians foolings on the matter was gained during his interview with the Ambasender. Although extracely polite and friendly, the Ambasender was completely uncoperative in terms of suggesting names of people Identity 1 aight contact in Indemesia or even in advising on such matters as visa, housing, travel arrangements, etc. The Consul General in New York was somewhat more comparative and Identity 1 received a temporary visa in about three weeks time.
- 4. All who not identity I feel be in a good of olde for the job. He is an older, scholarly-type gentleman with considerable background in Asian affairs, particularly thina. He appeared to a ree completely with our feeling that DTPHHAR must proceed very slowly in Indonesia and not try to make a big splash. His background and character are in keeping with such an approach. As feel that he definitely helpes us to convince DTPHAR headquarters of the wisdom of this





mothod of approach widely we have discussed majorous times with their people but have mover been sure as to whether it had been accepted there.

- him on the existing situation in Indensia and discussing possible fields of operation for DTPILLAR. Mind suggested that the aim of DTPILLAR should very definitely be to build up local groups and to stimulate them to occasinty action rather than to attempt to publicize DTPILLAR itself. Identity I was advised to mix freely and naturally with all types of people, including official and unofficial Americans, Dutch, Chinese and Indonesians, without allowing himself to become too closely associated with any particular group. Mind suggested an initial period of getting to know the local people before attempting any operations whatsoever.
- put initially on non-political projects such as adult education, health improvement, aid to universities, etc. within the Indonesian nonwarity. One specific idea that was discussed was the stimulation of an Indonesian downlites to prepare for free elections. It is felt that such a constitutes would be likely to be welcomed by prominent Indonesians and sould provide a mechanism for community action of a positive nature which light later be used for more direct anti-communist activities. Another specific project discussed was the sponsoring from Manila of a movie film on the Milippines which was recently produced under private sponsoring and puts considerable emphasis on the assistance the U.S. has given the Milippines; Identity I will discuss this further with the William people in Manila on his way out.
- open and would probably be the ensiest area for him to operate within. He was cautioned not to sears off the indepesions by pushing alread too quickly with Chinese groups but on the other hand not to neglect the potential in the field. It was suggested that by putting the exphasic on permedial the Chinese to become good indepesion citizens and on helping them to combat communist subversion within their can ranks, the indepesions would be less likely to take exception to his activities in this field. It was thought that a good place to start would be in the Chinese schools and press media.

In all of this briefing it was emphasized that we preferred not to try to masternind a detailed program from here but rather to give him certain broad guidence to assist him in his initial emploration and program development. We put heavy emphasis on the meed for close ecoperation between identity I and yourself in the field and tried to point out that not only would this prevent simps but that you would be in a position to assist him considerably by name checks, suggested contacts, eve. We asked that he try to talk over his plans with you fully before embarking on any actual operations. So, therefore, did not mention any of the specific proposals which have come to our attention over the past year but preferred to let you brief him on any of these which you
