SUBJECT: Committee for a Free Asia -- Radio Transmitter Proposal

1. You will recall at the PRC meeting on 7 May that it was agreed that funds would be earmarked for a radio transmitter complex (estimated cost \$5,000,000) for CFA broadcasts to an area extending from India through Indonesia, but that the expenditure of such funds would be contingent on specific PRC approval of a detailed proposal to be developed by CFA

2. One of the basic judgments to be reached is that concerning the security of the site at which such transmitter complex would be located.

3. You will recall that Burma, Thailand, and Pakistan were being considered. India, Indonesia, Malaya and Indochina appear to be not feasible locations for many reasons.

4. We should appreciate an evaluated judgment, which we can furnish CFA as a basis for planning, as to the relative security of each of these three countries as a site for such facilities, which under optimum conditions probably cannot be constructed in less than eighteen months.

5. We should appreciate your considering both the possibility of successful sabotage of such facilities, as well as the possibility of communist takeover of each country by force or subversion.

7/10/52 Kingman Dimpas advised re 7/10/52 that Pakistan is unequivocally the best site of these above. - Bowen
