We are considering utilizing a going agency under-written seminar project at Harvard University at which ten European graduate students of outstanding talents and promise have attended, as a vehicle for exposing outstanding Asian youths to the democratic way of life.

Although details are not completely worked out we should like to suggest that you be thinking about twenty possible Asian candidates who might be brought to Harvard at our expense for the summer of 1952.

Our current thinking calls for this to be a PILLAR sub-project, if agreeable to you, for which we would provide necessary funds, estimated at about [ ] For the summer of 1952, at least, we would also plan to continue with some European students.

Appreciate your thinking about this, and when we have coordinated here we shall send you complete details.

Jim Stewart, with whom this was briefly discussed, might explore possible candidates during his trip.
