FE Comments by

Item 207 - The FE Division suggested that DTFIRLAR consider the possibility of bringing labor leaders, women, professional people, and people other than students over to this country.

Asian Operations - FE stated that budget approval represented program approval but not specific project approval. FE thinks projects should be coordinated -- particularly in the field -- as implemented. It was stated that there would be close coordination between the witting DTFILLAR representative and the station chief, in accordance with the agreed upon Terms of Reference.

FF also raised the question of whether there was to be a covert connection between the overt PTPILIAR representative in the field and the local committees. Mr. Siegbert said this would be considered on an ad hos basis, but that it did not seem to be feasible to make such relationship covert in most cases.

Norean Operations - The FE Division suggests that more attention be directed at Korea,

Transfer of Projects - It was agreed that certain going projects which are presently operated by the FE Division would be considered for transfer to DTPILLAR. Those projects on which it is mutually agreed should be transferred will be turned over to DTPILLAR with the balance of funds allotted for such projects for the fiscal year.

and nothing in them conflicts with the OPC psychological warfare plan or any other CIA program in that area.

PY asked about the possibility of duplication of MSA and Point Four activity, particularly in the field of radio receiver distribution, and Mr. Siegbert assured him efforts were being made to prevent this. There is good liaison with these activities to minimize duplication.

It was pointed out that there are many new developments in the matter of radio receiving sets and DTFILLAR was advised to go slowly to be certain that their plans take into consideration such developments.

It was also pointed out that there is a black radio being planned for Formosa but it was agreed that this will not compete with DTPILLAR.
