- (S) Per your request, I will attempt to give you my candid impressions of the BND, Cathered over the past two years of association with them. I will not attempt to make this a study, just a rabbling account of my personal, limited views on this thing called the BND.
- A. Relationship in General (USAREUR/END): I can put it in one word excellent. We have a good friend, with neurly complete cooperation there is still a little problem in the SET field which I will explain later.
