Page 1 and 2 Even the Czech tendencies, which together with some of the Slovak separatists inclined to deal with Mr. Sidor, who during the second world war has been Ambassador of Slovakia to the Vatican, did not enter into relation with Gen. Prochala, or discontinued them, because of his separatist tendencies. One group of the Slovak separatists is rallied around Mr. Sidor, the second are followers of Mr. DURCANSKY, previously Slovakian Minister, of Foreign Affairs, who after the war was persecuted of collaboration with the Germans. He escaped as war criminal to Argentine and there he founded the center of his movement. With DURCANSKY none of the Czech side is counting, although the council of his party is founded on the collaboration of four parties, which are represented by its officials and which are: The Christian Social, The National Party, the Agrarian and the Labour Party. Page 3. In the home country these tendencies are opposed as well, chiefly because of the impossibility to obtain a clear picture of the contact which DURCANSKY's movement has with the communists. a regular contact is maintained by a courier sent from Argentine to Slovakia and vice versa.</p> <p>THAT IS ALL THE PERTINENT INFORMATION ON SUBJECT IN THE DOCUMENT.
