

FUNCTIONS OF THE DIRECTOR OF CENTRAL INTELLIGENCE

Subject to existing law and the President's directive of 22 January 1946, and to the direction and control of the National Intelligence Authority, the Director of Central Intelligence:

1. Sits as a non-voting member of the National Intelligence Authority.

2. Directs all activities of the Central Intelligence Group.

3. Is advised by an Intelligence Advisory Board consisting of the heads (or their representatives) of the principal military and civilian intelligence agencies of the Government having functions related to the national security, as determined by the National Intelligence Authority.

4. Accomplishes the compilation and evaluation of intelligence relating to the national security, and the appropriate dissemination within the Government of the resulting strategic and national policy intelligence. In so doing he makes full use of the staff and facilities of the intelligence agencies of the State, War and Navy Departments.

5. In performing 4 above, undertakes such research and analysis as may be necessary to determine what functions in fields of national security intelligence are not being presently performed or are not being adequately performed. Based upon these determinations he may centralize such research and analysis activities as may, in his opinion and that of the appropriate number or members of the Intelligence Advisory Board, be more efficiently or effectively accomplished centrally.

6. Plans for the coordination of such of the activities of the intelligence agencies of the State, War and Navy Departments as relate to the national security, and recommends to the National Intelligence Authority the establishment of such over-all policies

and objectives as will assure the most effective accomplishment of the national intelligence mission.

7. Acts as the agent of the National Intelligence Authority in coordinating all Federal foreign intelligence activities related to the national security to ensure that the over-all policies and objectives established by that Authority are properly implemented and executed.

8. Performs, for the benefit of the intelligence agencies of the State, War and Navy Departments, such services of common concern as the National Intelligence Authority determines can be more efficiently accomplished centrally, including:

(a) The conduct of all organized Federal espionage and counter-espionage operations outside the United States and its possessions for the collection of foreign intelligence information required for the national security; and

(b) The conduct of all Federal monitoring of press and propaganda broadcasts of foreign powers required for the collection of intelligence information related to the national security.

9. Performs such other functions and duties related to intelligence affecting the national security as the President and the National Intelligence Authority may from time to time direct.

~~FUNCTIONS OF THE DIRECTOR OF CENTRAL INTELLIGENCE~~

Pursuant to the President's letter of 22 January 1946 designating this Authority as responsible for planning, developing and coordinating all Federal foreign intelligence activities so as to ensure the most effective accomplishment of the intelligence mission related to the national security, the functions of the Director of Central Intelligence are hereby redefined as follows, subject to the provisions of said letter:

1. Paragraph 3 of the President's letter of 22 January 1946 defined the functions of the Director of Central Intelligence as follows:

"3. Subject to the existing law, and to the direction and control of the National Intelligence Authority, the Director of Central Intelligence shall:

"a. Accomplish the compilation and evaluation of intelligence relating to the national security, and the appropriate dissemination within the Government of the resulting strategic and national policy intelligence. In so doing, full use shall be made of the staff and facilities of the intelligence agencies of your departments.

"b. Plan for the coordination of such of the activities of the Intelligence agencies of your departments as relate to the national security and recommend to the National Intelligence Authority the establishment of such over-all policies and objectives as will ensure the most effective accomplishment of the national intelligence mission.

4. Perform, for the benefit of said intelligence agencies, such services of common concern as the National Intelligence Authority determines can be more efficiently accomplished centrally.

"4. Perform such other functions and duties related to intelligence affecting the national security as the President and the National Intelligence Authority may from time to time direct."

2. In performing the functions specified in paragraph 3-a of the President's letter, the Director of Central Intelligence is hereby authorized to undertake such research and analysis as may be necessary to determine what functions in the fields of national security intelligence are not being presently performed or are not being adequately performed. Based upon these determinations, the Director of Central Intelligence may centralize such research and analysis activities as may, in his opinion and that of the appropriate number or numbers of the Intelligence Advisory Board, be more efficiently or effectively accomplished centrally.

3. In addition to the functions specified in paragraph 3-b of the President's letter and in accordance with paragraph 4 of N.I.A. Directive No. 1, the Director of Central Intelligence is hereby directed to act as the agent of this Authority in coordinating all Federal foreign intelligence activities related to the national security to ensure that the over-all policies and objectives established by this Authority are properly implemented and executed.

4. Pursuant to paragraph 3-c of the President's letter, the Director of Central Intelligence is hereby directed to perform the following services of common concern which this Authority has determined can be more efficiently accomplished centrally:

a. Conduct of all organized Federal espionage and counter-espionage operations outside the United States and its possessions for the col-
