SUBJECT: Alois WOLF - Political Emigrant or Communist Agent?

1. Upon request by Bavarian police and separately by the state secretariate for refugee matters, Austrian citizen WOLF was taken over by police at SALZBURG station, although he possessed no identification papers. According to his statement, Alois WOLF,

born October 9, 1915, at GRAZ,

had left Austria in 1948 and moved to PÖSSNECK (Eastern Germany) to marry Isolde, née WLEYKAUF, born 9/15/1925. After working with East-German industries he was sent to East Berlin, where he was trained at Hennigsdorf technical school (steel engineering); by the middle of October, because of alleged espionage, he was arrested by East-German state police and imprisoned at Potsdam. At the end of November he was released, via Helmstedt, was expelled to Western Germany. He finally reached Camp PIDING in Bavaria, from where he was sent to Salzburg. WOLF's wife and daughter Gudrun remained in Eastern Germany (address unknown).

2. WOLF's Austrian citizenship was confirmed by WEITZ (Styria police). His last address until 1948 had been GLEISDORF near GRAZ, 13 Mühlgasse. In 1950, thru the Austrian Delegation at Berlin-Dahlem, he stated to have received an Austrian family passport, issued by Vienna Ministry of Interior. Presently such passport is allegedly in possession of his wife, who intends to follow her husband to Austria.

3. Austrian police believes that WOLF is possibly acting as Communist agent, but could not reject his entry into Austria.
