In November 1953, the following information was obtained from Informant 6030, who received it from a sub-source of unknown reliability:

Sometime during the foregoing period, an Austrian Criminal Police Officer (M), was reportedly arrested in Linz, in the State of Upper Austria, by members of the Austrian State Security Police. During the course of the subsequent interrogation, the official allegedly admitted he was employed by Alois M. (born 1 February 1919), and in return for 1,500.00 Austrian schillings (current exchange rate: 26 sch = \$1.00) monthly, submitted reports to M every two (2) weeks. The official averred that the information which he forwarded was falsified, and contended that he could verify his statement by producing copies of the reports he submitted to M. The official was allegedly unaware of the identity of the intelligence organization which he served, but was of the opinion that M was employed with the West German Intelligence Blank (Bureau Blank). Source averred that Dr. Gerhard Lehner of Vienna, Austria, (LAD) is also employed by M as a sub-source, and receives 1,500.00 US monthly for his services. M has allegedly confided to Lehner that he (LAD) is constantly surveilled by the Austrian State Security Police. (fmu) Heinz, a former Lieutenant Colonel in the German Army, was reportedly recently dismissed from the Blank Agency, as the result of a quarrel with the Netherlands Branch of the Blank Agency's Counter Intelligence Section. Heinz is said to be seeking a new intelligence assignment. (m) (fmu) Keich, a lawyer in Frankfurt, Germany, and one of Heinz' contacts, (LAD) has allegedly stated that Heinz has been working for the KGB (Russian Intelligence Service) since 1945, and allegedly maintains close liaison with KGB.

... was the only employee in Vienna, Soviet
citizen, who worked for the Austrian State Security Police.
He was assigned to work for the State Security Police in Vienna, Austria, during 1951, and
was employed as a telephone operator in the Summary Office, and
was responsible for maintaining telephone connections. Current exchange rates
of the Austrian Schilling were 1.00 to 1.00 American (1.00 American
was equivalent to 1.00 Austrian Schilling). The telephone number of "Central" was 411111,
and the telephone number of "Summary" was 411112. The State Security Police produced copies of
all telephone conversations which took place between the two offices.
The official was released from service in 1954. He officially was released because of the
death of his wife. The telephone connection he served, the one of the
Summary Office, was taken over by another official, named Intelligence Clerk
Guenther Klemm. He stated that Mr. Guenther Klemm of Vienna, Austria, was
the telephone operator in the Summary Office. However, he did not
know him personally. He also stated that he learned that he
had previously been employed by the Austrian State Security Police.
He held a telephone license and was issued it in 1950 or 1951. The report-
edly, he was originally employed by the Austrian State Security Police
as a telephone operator branch of the "Central" Agency's Counter Intelligence
Section. When he left the "Central" State Security Assignment, he
went to Berlin, Germany, and one of his first contacts was
with the American Central Intelligence Agency. He has been working for the CIA "Counter
Intelligence Section" since 1954, and continues to maintain close liaison
with the "Central" Agency. (Reported by Agent [REDACTED]
