Kats will visit the Embassy of Isroel on June 16, 1961, and will bring to Rasmon a book on the Sichmonn trial written by a "Hungarian Jow," the title of which is unknown although the informent learned it was an English translation of the Hungarian language.

Kats has also advised that he is of Hungarian contraction which explains his Hungarian contacts.

Adolf Bichmann is presently being tried in Israel on wharges that he killed 6,000,000 Jose during the Mitler region in Garmany.

On Jume 9, 1961, another informant, who has furnished reliable information in the past, advised that Mr. Kats is acquainted with Mr. Ferenc Gajda of the Legation of the Bungarian People Republic and on June 15, 1961, Kats thanks Mr. Gajda for a favor extended by the latter on June 14, 1961.

The "Diplomatic List," published by the Department of State, for April, 1961, lists Cajda as Archivist - Secretary at the Hungarian Legation.
